Communion

All those who are baptized and believe that Christ is present in this meal are welcome to receive communion with us.

When directed by an Usher, please come forward using the center aisle and kneel or stand at the altar rail. You will receive the bread then the wine. Grape juice & gluten free wafers are available upon request. Children who do not yet commune receive a blessing. Once you have been served, please return to your pew by the side aisles.

If you are unable to come forward but wish to receive communion, let an Usher know and communion will be brought to you.

Summer Sermon Series



The Summer Sermon Series Continues with “The Holy Spirit Month”

*What does the Bible say about the Holy Spirit?
What important role does the Holy Spirit play in our lives?*

These and similar questions about the Holy Spirit were submitted earlier this year by members of Calvary when asked about topics to be covered in future sermon series.

Beginning this weekend, five weeks will be dedicated to this important subject, sampling from a number of biblical sources. The weekly topics will be shaped around Luther’s Small Catechism and his teaching on the 3rd Article of the Apostle’s Creed. Pastor Ken will approach this theme from the standpoint of what we mean when we say “*I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.*”
