"Praise be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves have received from God."

II Corinthians 1:4

As a pastor I have used this verse more times than I can count – it's been hundreds of times however. II Corinthians 1:4 forms the basis of the opening sentence of the order of service for Christian burial in the Lutheran Book of Worship. I have always thought of it as a verse to comfort the grieving, but Paul uses this "comforting statement" to remind us that God comforts people suffering in any way. When folks attend a funeral, they are in a very wonderful way "comforting others (the grieving family) with the same comfort (they) have received from God."

People who attend a funeral all do so out of respect for the grieving family or because they are a friend or co-worker or knew the deceased. They may also do so because they themselves have been in the same place – grieving the loss of someone close to them, and they know how it feels. But Christians who attend such gatherings also do so to give "praise to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus" – who raised Jesus from the dead and gives hope to those who suffer loss. They add the "distinctively Christian" component of coming to worship the Savior whose resurrection insures theirs one day, in other words.

As a pastor I am always grateful for the people who attend a funeral, and make it a point before the close of the service to express that gratitude to the attendees, both my own but particularly on behalf of the family. I tell them "they are doing a good work, and it is much appreciated." As most of you know, we are in the opening stages of becoming a "Stephen Ministry" congregation. Stephen Ministry is dedicated to comforting one another in their sorrows with the comfort of Christ, and those of you who



may become Stephen Ministers in our congregation may also be adding another vital component to your care – your own personal experience in suffering a loss.

You, the Stephen Minister therefore, have such giftedness – such a vital and needed combination of characteristics, your faith and your compassion, born of faith and perhaps your own memory of the time you hurt or were anxious about life. As your pastor, I want to thank those of you who are even considering becoming a Stephen Minister and may, if the Lord leads, be a part of our first Stephen Ministry team by enrolling in our training sessions.

On behalf of someone or "*several some-ones*" you may care for, I also want to say thank you. You would be part of a wonderful shared ministry, one that extends the care that I freely admit I cannot always provide. Just as my presence alone at a funeral service, no matter how wonderful a message I may bring cannot do all the work of comforting, so my ministry as pastor cannot alone reach all the people of our congregation. By becoming a Stephen Minister, you would be multiplying our caregiving enormously, you may be just the person someone needs, and you would be gladdening my heart as I know I have someone to share this important work of ministry with – as would I might add, our other Stephen Ministry Leaders Scott and Peggy Langelin.

I invite everyone to come to the sessions we are having on March 3rd and 4th immediately after worship to answer your questions about Stephen Ministry. We'll try to address questions both from the perspective of prospective ministers as well as prospective care receivers. Keep us in your prayers. I close with a quote from Father John Boeglin of Holy Family Catholic Church of Jasper, Indiana, and a Stephen Congregation;

"There's no way I could minister to so many without Stephen Ministers. They are my most valued lay partners in one-to-one care of our parishioners.

Proposed Mission & Vision Statements, Goals and Timeline for CLC Stephen Ministry

The Mission :

"Sharing the love of Jesus Christ with hurting people"

The Vision :

"Inspired by Jesus, who taught us to look for him in hurting faces, we seek to provide people experiencing a loss in their life or facing a prolonged period of personal struggle with well- equipped Christians who are able to provide compassionate Christian care that receivers of this care might see the light of Jesus in their life again.

Our Immediate Goals are:

- Commission our Stephen Ministry Leader Team, establish and publicize Stephen Ministry to our congregation.
- Launch Stephen Minister Training Courses at Calvary and establish a calendar for classes.
- Prepare members of Calvary to receive Stephen Care by the fall of 2018.
- Network with other Stephen Congregations in our area for the purpose of mutual support and continuing education for our ministers.

Immediate Timeline:

- **March 3rd & 4th** : Q and A session about Stephen Ministry after worship services.
- **March 5th -20th**: Ongoing recruitment of CLC members for first Stephen Minister training course.
- March 19th -26th: Conduct initial interviews with prospective Stephen Ministers.

April 4th: First Stephen Minister Training session begins to be conducted over the next 20-25 weeks.
