"The Spirit gives life, the flesh counts for nothing. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life." John 6:63

Why do you give? When you hear of a need in some part of the world, and you are persuaded to give, what was the "deciding factor?" Do you give because you are persuaded by a photo, or the "pitch" of a telephone solicitor? All of these things have prompted me to give – though I do also think about the work the organization does and I even try to imagine the feelings of the people the organization helps, as though I were presenting a gift directly to them. Nevertheless I am not sure this is the approach we ought to adopt in our giving. We should not give simply because we are asked or because we may derive satisfaction in knowing we are helping in some way....we should give because we are convinced that no other course of action is possible for us.

Let me explain. In the passage from John that I have cited above, Jesus has just finished saying that he is the Messiah of Israel, their long awaited Savior (John 6:52-62). He called himself in this lesson *"the Bread of Life"*, and the *"True Bread from Heaven"*. He said that his body is true food and his blood is true drink. As you might expect, this left not a few folks perplexed and some just gave up on him and went away. What he was saying "made no sense", it was not "reasonable". Many said *"this is a hard teaching...who can accept it"*.

Only those convinced Jesus was speaking to their hearts as God's Son could and eventually did accept it. Appeals to their mind would not do - you can't convince someone to believe this sort of thing. What has this to do with giving? Just this; appeals to our mind can elicit a response and often do awaken in us desire to contribute and make a difference in some way. In our congregation, we appeal to



you to give so that our administrative, pastoral and facility needs are met and our "mission of the month" partners who are involved with evangelism, bible translation, alleviating the causes of poverty, and supporting seminary education are supported.

But Christian stewards recognize that there is more to their contributions than sustaining important work - they recognize that intentional, joyful, generous, and yes even sacrificial giving and living is how our lives were intended to be lived – it is what we were created for. It is evidence that "the Spirit that gives life" is in us. These words that Jesus speaks which otherwise "make no sense" provide proper perspective about giving. They help us see giving as 'the only way possible for us to live'. Christians can and should be prudent in matters finance and over household budgets and we ought to make careful decisions with regard to church budgets too. But one can't be Christian and not be generous. The life the Spirit gives is gratitude coupled with generosity. It's just who we are.

Please remember two upcoming important events in our congregation. On November 5^{th} our Endowment Committee has planned an information session to inform and invite you to consider supporting the work it supports in and through our congregation. The event will take place from 2:00 – 3:30 on that day. The following Sunday, November 12^{th} , immediately after our 9:00 AM worship, the Stewardship Committee will host a brunch at which we will speak about our church's vision, goals, and present needs and invite you to make a pledge for the upcoming year.

Before those two events we ask that you pray. Ask the Lord to speak into your heart about your part in our work. Pray that we will all see and perceive nothing so much as the reaching, teaching, baptizing and blessing work that the Spirit of Life - Jesus Christ has entrusted to us.

Duty and Delight – Living and Giving Faithfully

Marty Haugen, in his lituray "Now the Feast and Celebration." begins the preface to the Holy Communion with, "It is our duty and delight that we should everywhere and always offer thanks and praise to you, O God, through Jesus Christ... "



Duty and delight are a wonderful combination. In Romans 15:27, Paul wrote, "For they were pleased to do it, and indeed they owe it to them." One of my seminary professors used to say, "A text without a context is a pretext," and he was certainly correct. Paul is talking about going on to Spain by way of Rome, but first he's going to carry some relief for the saints to Jerusalem. Sharing that offering brought those who gave it a sense of both duty and delight.

"They were pleased to do it...," suggests **delight;** "and indeed they owe it to them" means they realized it was their **duty**. For the mature Christian, the offering is an act of worship. The mystic Evelyn Underhill wrote that the primary purpose of worship is to adore God. Our worship through the offering should always be our delightful duty — indeed, our adoration of God.
