

Like young Timothy, to whom the Apostle Paul wrote this letter of encouragement, I am a child and grandchild of two faithful women. My mom Elsie Bertha Tuft and her mom Minnie Emma Martha Bertha (yes, she had four names even *before* her sir-name of Wadke) were faithful women who taught me by example the importance and yes even discipline of regular worship and with it, giving to the work of the Lord. My grandma Minnie kept her offering money in a Chase-Sanborn coffee can on her dresser in her bedroom. She would add to it from grocery change and eventually from her Social Security check each month. Each week she would take a portion and bring it with her as she left for church. My mom always made sure we kids had a weekly Sunday school offering envelope with a quarter in it and fifty cents on Easter.

When I was confirmed, I honestly remember being proud when the church secretary handed me a box of offering envelopes with my name typed on a mail label on the top of the box. I quite honestly could not wait to take the first one out. I was confirmed on Palm Sunday....so my first offering was going to be for Easter Sunday. I knew from mom's example it better be a little bit better offering than usual! Fortunately confirmation then as now brought some pretty nice gifts of money the week before, so I had some to give...and boy did I make sure that the usher noticed I was putting my *own* envelope in that week! Now I know Jesus may have frowned on such a show of pride and piety. Our Lord in Matthew 6 taught us that when we

give we should not let our left hand know what the right was doing, but give in secret. But this was for me almost as thrilling as going to the altar for confirmation. (The next best thing was getting a call from the head of our church usher ministry Carl Zitzer informing me that I was going to be on *his* ushering team, and making my debut the following Sunday, but that’s a story for another time!)

My point is this - all those years of watching my grandmother arrive at church with her offering from her Chase-Sanborn coffee can and my mother putting a buff colored Sunday school offering envelope in my hand before I went with her to church taught me that giving is part of worshiping. Giving is a witness to “*the faith that lives in us*”, and when combined with other’s offering does literally “*fan into flame the gift of God*”. When I was in college my mom once “intercepted” my giving statement from the church...opened it (she swore by mistake!) saw what I was giving...and said “*Kenny...are you sure you can be doing that?*” It wasn’t really all that much I thought, but I think mom in her own way was proud that I caught on to what she taught me, and in her own way was saying “*your grandma would have been proud too*”.


