"But God has combined the members of the body and has given greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it."

I Corinthians 12:24b-26

In John 8:31-32 Jesus said "*If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.*" Disciples are believers who "hold" to Jesus' teaching. Over the summer I suggested the following signs or "habits" based on a book entitled "*The 7 Habits of Discipleship*" by Pastor Rick Foss, who presented a thoroughly Biblical way of being a follower of Jesus. To review, they are;

Worship weekly Pray daily Read and study the Bible regularly Seek to live your faith in daily life **Seek the supporting relationship of other Christians** Grow in giving toward the goal of tithing Learn to share faith with others

The fifth "habit" is "seek the supporting relationship of other Christians". In the above passage from I Corinthians, Paul accepted that Christians were "members" of the church – but he pressed that understanding to claim that what we belonged to was each other. Now the word "member" has many potential meanings. We can be members of school organizations or political parties, in which case we'd be like-minded on a set of issues. We can be members of "Amazon Prime" and get free shipping on all kinds of neat stuff! We can even be "members" of a credit card company – and if you don't believe me, look at that American Express card in your wallet you'll see that's exactly what they (it) calls you.

But Christians "belong" to one another – in the sense of being mutually dependent as well as accountable. In our baptism rite, we say "*By water and the Holy Spirit we are made members of the church, which is the body of Christ. As we live with him and with his people, we grow in faith, love and obedience to the will of God.*" I have often said (tongue-in-cheek of course) that of the two "works of God" in Baptism – the first being reborn as children of God through the forgiveness of sins, and the second being made members of the church – the latter is the much more challenging one for God to pull off! Living with one another is not easy – no matter the nature of the relationship. Being a

member of "Amazon Prime" and saving money, and partnering with other Christians to grow in faith, saving one another in times of crisis or from falling into sin are vastly different things!

But this is the will, or design of God for the church - and pursuing these relationships is a mark of being a disciple of Jesus. Yes, we come together to worship, to serve, to learn - all of which is evidence that we are fulfilling this mark of discipleship. But more than a good work to check off a list, seeking supporting relationships with other Christians is a matter of survival.

Christianity is still accepted in our culture but that I think most would agree, it is something that is eroding. These days identifying as a follower of Christ earns one *less* respect and *more* suspicion. In Paul's time that was all the more true – so he knew that if Christians did not respect one another and seek out supporting, interdependent relationships with one another, they and the church would be the worse off. God designed the church and us to care for one another. That means our spiritual well-being above all else, but it also includes more mundane things like noticing, and then reaching out to a person who is new in the community and offering your friendship.

And it also means cultivating one to one, or as our North American Lutheran Church calls them "Life to Life" discipleship relationships, through which we serve as encouragers of one another and examples to one another of how to live out all the other "marks" of being a disciple. On our own we might very well worship, read the Bible and pray regularly, and live our daily lives by faith. Yes, we all have the Holy Spirit, who Luther said "*keeps us united with Jesus Christ in the one true faith*." But we also have each other, to lean into and learn from when our old sinful selves may be causing us to "*miss the mark*."

We have amazing giftedness within the body, because we have each other. Disciples of Jesus more than acknowledge the gift of their fellow believers – we know we simply can't live as we were created to without them.

Congregation News and Events



Several weeks ago, we included a summary of actions from the NALC Annual Convocation as a bulletin insert. If you did not receive one, you can obtain a copy from the church office or by going to www.thenalc.org, click "Lutheran Week Archives", and then follow the tab down to see the various reports and videos from the gathering, including the "Convocation Recap".

I attended several events during the week, including the Youth Ministry Symposium with Gary Pecuch, who was at Calvary recently, the Braaten-Benne lectures in theology – with this years theme being "The Person of the Holy Spirit" and, of course, the General Assembly itself.

We have a wonderful church body, with superb leadership led by Bishop John Bradosky. He will end his term as presiding bishop in the summer of 2019, so an election for a new bishop will be held at the 2019 Convocation in Indianapolis.

The NALC grew modestly in 2018 and now has 424 exclusively NALC congregations and also relates to 91 congregations with dual NALC/ LCMC status, primarily so that they can be served by pastors from either church body. Nearly ³/₄ of our congregations list themselves as small town or rural, 63 as large city suburban, and 46 are within a major metropolitan area. Four new congregations this year were formed by, and for, Oromo-speaking Christians – most of which are first generation immigrants from the Sudan, Ethiopia and Eritrea in East Africa.

The North American Lutheran Seminary (NALS) has developed, like many higher education institutions, an extensive online presence and satellite locations to make the process of formation for ministry less expensive for students, thus holding down tuition and other costs associated with seminary. The NALC had 10 candidates for ordination enter the seminary process in the past year, and nine completed the process and are seeking their first calls. The supply of pastors in the NALC is generally quite good, with continued interest from current ELCA and LCMC pastors in joining the roster of NALC clergy and bolstered by a steady supply of young theologians. God be praised.

Financially, the NALC has experienced deficits in the last three years due primarily to a leveling of congregational giving, but after its 8th year remains on solid financial footing. Expenses owing to the addition of program staff contribute to the deficits, but were necessary so that service to congregations could be enhanced. Reserves owing to tight budgets and generous gifts in its infancy enable us to enter the end of the year with reserves in the general fund of nearly \$775,000, theological education fund of over \$1,300,000 and Disaster Response of over \$430,000. A projected general fund deficit of roughly \$145,000 on a budget of just over \$2,000,000 for 2018 is nonetheless within its reach to reduce or eliminate, and if each congregation of the NALC contributed just \$1 per member before year end, it would be!

The NALC Disaster Response Ministry is active in reaching out to people in the Carolinas, and remains in Texas working with re-building efforts. The newly-formed Great Commission Fund, led by Pastor Gemechis Buba, helped the four new congregations that formed this past year extend their ministry, and in two cases secured modest buildings to house their congregations. A missionary to the Sudan was ordained and commissioned, and will work with displaced refugees in that war-torn region. Again, God be praised!

Ministry partners such as Lutheran World Relief, Lutherans for Life, Sola Publishing, with its increasing array of solid Lutheran publications, World Mission Prayer League, and Water Mission all gave reports at the Assembly and gave evidence that wonderful work is being done through NALC churches. We were encouraged to keep up to date by picking up copies of the monthly newsletter, the quarterly publications of the Women of the NALC and the North American Lutheran Seminary, and the bi-monthly magazine "Connections." Above all, keep the NALC, whose core values to be Christ-Centered, Mission-Driven, Traditionally-Grounded and Congregationally-Focused were in evidence all week in Denver at this year's convocation.
