Communion

All those who are baptized and believe that Christ is present in this meal are welcome to receive communion with us.

Grape juice & gluten free wafers are available upon request. Children who do not yet commune receive a blessing. Once you have been served, please return to your pew by the side aisles. If you are unable to come forward but wish to receive communion, let an Usher know and communion will be brought to you.

Total registration cost is \$464. Scholarships are available. The trip is open for students entering high school (8th graders) through graduating seniors.

That week is open to all age campers kindergarten through high school.
