August Mission of the Month: Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus, International Mission Society

The EECMY Church is committing themselves to fully support God's missionary task by sending missionaries to neighboring countries and beyond. The EECMY have found studies which show that there are 16,332 ethnic groups in the world and among these 6,700 ethnic groups have not heard the Gospel yet. The majority of them hardly know the name Jesus. EECMY International Mission Society will do its part to take the Gospel to these areas. They have the strong conviction that their missionaries will be an instrument to gather this last harvest.

Annual Collection for Lutheran World Relief

School Kits: Include the following items in each School Kit:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks (280-300 sheets total) of wide- or college-ruled paper approximately 8" X 10½"; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 21/2" eraser

A group of Calvary members are sewing the backpacks. Just bring in the supplies for each school kit and they will be put into a backpack.

If you sew and would like to make a few bags, please contact Jane Krause or Judy DeBruine. We have a supply of fabric and rope.

Health Kits: Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:

- One light-weight bath-size towel (20" X 40" to 52" X 27"), dark color recommended
- Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap, any brand, in original wrapping
- One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging* Calvary has a large supply
 of toothbrushes—you are welcome to take them for your kits
- One sturdy comb (no picks or fine-toothed combs); remove packaging
- One metal nail clippers (attached file optional); remove packaging

All kits must be turned in by the end of September!

^{*}Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a businesssize envelope; no plastic bags or wrap
