Lessons & Carols, Dec. 6th—3pm

Calvary's biennial Christmas Concert takes the form of the Lessons and Carols service, a ceremony performed around the world.

Lessons and Carols has its roots in the United Kingdom, but ours will have a flavor reflecting Calvary's heritage. Readings will be offered up by many Calvary members and staffers; stirring hymns of the season will be led for the congregation to sing; and carols and other Advent and Christmas music will be presented by Calvary's Contemporary Christian Music ensembles, the Celebration Ringers Handbell Choir, and the Alleluia Choir.

The Alleluia Choir and Celebration Ringers will be under the direction of Gene Traas, Calvary's Director of Music Ministry, who will also be leading hymns on the 1998 Lynn Dobson pipe organ.

The Lessons and Carols concert is free to the public, with a reception held afterward. The reception will feature a variety of Nativity Scene displays from around the world.

Christ the King Sunday

Sunday, November 22 was the last Sunday in the Church Year. Next Sunday the whole thing starts over with the First Sunday in Advent. The lessons emphasize the reign of Christ. In Jeremiah, God promises a king in David's line who will rule wisely, maintain law and justice, and be called, "The Lord is our Righteousness." In Colossians, St. Paul seems to be quoting a hymn or creedal statement that proclaims Jesus as the first of everything and authority over all. Paul concludes by saying that all this took place "when He made peace by His death on the cross." The Gospel lesson is that story of the cross, with its touching tale of the penitent thief hanging next to our Lord.

In the New Testament, Jesus is clearly identified as that King. Sunday's lesson from Colossians is just one place where He is seen as Co-Creator, the fullness of God, and King. In Sunday's Gospel lesson, the identity of King is made facetiously and mockingly. Most bizarre of all, it is His indictment and verdict, written in Hebrew, Latin and Greek, above Him on the cross: "THIS IS THE KING OF THE JEWS." The taunts of the soldiers are filled with satire and irony: "If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself." Jesus had a different goal: as King of Jews and Gentiles alike, He saved us!

On Christ the King Sunday we use the color White to signify purity, holiness, glory, and joy.

The Call Process

The Holy Spirit certainly has been at work with and through the Call Committee these past several months. We know that God is leading this process and that God already knows who will be the next Pastor at Calvary. We thought at this time it would be helpful to share the steps that the Call Committee is going through to meet that person.

Our process began by surveying the congregation on the top ministry needs of Calvary. We took that information and completed a Congregational Profile that was submitted to the NALC. The NALC then shared our Congregational Profile with pastors actively seeking a call. In addition, the NALC shares Congregational Profiles with all NALC pastors once a month.

If a candidate is interested in Calvary based on our Congregational Profile, he or she submits a Pastoral Profile that our committee reviews and discusses. From there, we decide as a committee if we would like to hear sermons from the candidate or not. After the committee listens to and discusses the sermons, an initial interview may take place. Depending on where the person is currently serving, this initial interview may take place face to face, via phone or via video conference. If we feel God is leading us towards a path together, we will have additional interviews and conversations. This may include visiting the pastor's current congregation to hear them preach and lead worship.

As we become more confident that God is leading us down the same path we will ask the candidate to come to Calvary with their family to preach for a weekend. We may bring more than one pastor & their family to Calvary to preach. Ultimately the Call Committee will recommend a pastor that we believe God has chosen to be the next Shepard of Calvary. At this time a special congregational meeting will be called and the congregation will vote whether or not to extend a call to the recommended pastor. Upon a successful vote, a formal Call will be extended. Once the Pastor accepts the Call, arrangements will be made for moving, installation and celebration.

It is important to point out that at any time in these steps the pastor or the Committee may feel that God is not leading us down the same path and the process will cease with that particular pastor. Accordingly, the NALC will continue to send us Pastoral Profiles regardless of where we are in the process with other pastoral candidates.

The Call Committee has worked diligently to come up with a strong, honest Congregational Profile that highlights all of the wonderful attributes of Calvary. We have also spent many hours crafting interview questions for all stages of the call process. We have spent time in Bible study and prayer, working together to patiently wait for God's will to be done. We have recently received the first pastoral profiles from the NALC and are at the beginning stages of listening to sermons. While we are excited to take this next step in the process, we know that this process may proceed slowly over the next several months. We ask for your continued patience, support and prayers during this process. Feel free to speak to any of the committee members for clarification on the call process.

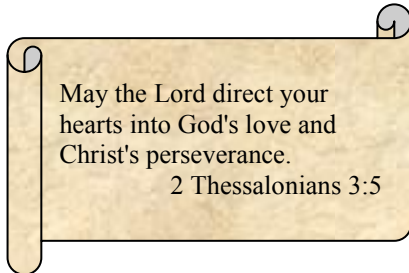
