Summer Scripture Reading

As the summer approaches, I thought we'd attempt a summer reading program. Each week, I'll pick 6 readings. Each day, take a moment, read the assigned reading then pray:

Thank God for his blessings and ask God for his guidance and insight for your day.

A quick refresher on how to find stuff in the bible! Most Bible references look like this:

Galatians 1:6-12

- 1. The first part is the name of the **book** in the bible. The easiest way to find the book is to check your table of content! Once you have the page number of the start of the book, turn to it!
- 1. The number after the book is the **chapter** number. In your Bible, these are the larger numbers within the paragraphs. Find the chapter number next. In our example, you'd be looking for chapter 1.
- 1. The numbers after the colon are the verse numbers. These are the little numbers within the chapter. Start reading at the first verse number and read all the way through the end of the last verse number. In our example, you'd read starting at verse 6 thru the end of verse 12, right before the tiny 13 in chapter 1.

To review: book \rightarrow Galatians, chapter \rightarrow 1, verses \rightarrow 6 thru the end of 12.

Now, let's begin! For the coming week, here are the assigned readings:

Tuesday	May 31	Acts 13:44-52
Wednesday	June 1	Romans 12:1-8
Thursday	June 2	Romans 12:9-21
Friday	June 3	2 Thessalonians 2:13-17
Saturday	June 4	Psalm 8
