The Shepherd's Notebook

How is it with your soul?

Some thoughts on spiritual formation, care and direction

“How is it with your soul?”

Sooner or later, most every pastoral visit I make will get around to this question. Truth be told, I even ask it of myself. And, why not?

Certainly, soul-tending lays at the very heart of pastoral care. Further, if I'm not tending to my own soul, I won't be much good at looking after the souls of God's people. “Do as I say, not as I do” doesn't cut it when it comes to preparing myself or God's people for daily life.

Which leads me to questions some of my friends at Calvary have been asking. Questions like “How do you take care of your soul?” and “What's that STS behind your name stand for?” The second question actually helps answer the first.

“Pastor, how *do* you take care of your soul?”

That said, the two most enduring of my soul-care practices are being part of The Society of the Holy Trinity (STS) and having a spiritual director. More about spiritual direction next time. For now, I'd like to introduce you to the finest professional ministerial support network I've ever known, **The Society of the Holy Trinity** (*Societas Trinitatis Sanctus*, or STS).

Time like these are no time to be alone in ministry, and being part of STS is what keeps me from feeling all alone in my calling to the Holy Ministry of Word and Sacraments. STS is my ministerium, or order in the religious sense. There

are nearly 300 of us – men and women, all ordained Lutheran clergy from three countries (The United States, Canada and Australia so far). We're a regular alphabet soup of denominations: NALC, LCMC, ELCA, LC-MS, and WELS from the USA alone. In times of doctrinal confusion and moral uncertainty, we support each other in remaining faithful to the promises we made when we were ordained.



As pastors, we are called to reflect the light and life of Christ to a world that is absorbed in itself, afflicted by indifference and even hostility to God and to neighbors, and agonizing over what the future holds. As brothers and sisters in ordained ministry, we are encouraged and strengthened by using the daily prayer offices and the daily lectionary of the Church, and by studying the Scriptures, the Confessions, the church fathers and the church's tradition. We also keep up with each other's joys and sorrows, sharing family news, congregational insights and lots of laughs. Our retreats are what you might call holy marathons – we pause and gather to pray and worship six times every 24 hours, and between those times we study, eat, relax and reflect on our lives in Christ and in Ministry. And they are refreshing! I come away from each retreat re-charged and ready to address the challenges of 21st century pastoral ministry, knowing that I am not alone and that support from colleagues is only a prayer request away.

All of this is captured in those three initials. STS. And, I thank God for it!

Pastoral Search Team Updates

The Pastoral Search Team has been working on the preliminary steps to be taken before we request names of candidates from the NALC. As you know, we welcome your prayers for the team, the congregation, and the candidate God has in mind for us, as well as that candidate's family and congregation he or she may be serving right now.

We also encourage everyone to join us in studying Paul's letters to Timothy and Titus as a way of discerning the character and role of a pastor. During the Sunday education hour, Larry Bonier continues to lead us through the book the team is using as one of our resources, *When the Word Leads Your Pastoral Search*. We encourage everyone to come to this discussion, whether or not you've read the book.

The search team had a very good meeting with the author, Chris Brauns, in September. He stressed the importance of the congregation being in prayer and Bible study throughout this process, and he emphasized the importance of not rushing through our mission. We are grateful for the patience, support and interest everyone has shown. God has a wonderful future planned for Calvary.

We are currently completing the congregational profile requested by the NALC. While much of the information we're providing is of a statistical nature, we are also asked to identify the five most critical tasks required for ministry at Calvary. As part of discerning what these tasks are, we are working on a long-range strategic plan that will be submitted to the council and the congregation in the coming weeks. The congregation will also be asked to complete and return a brief

survey in mid-November. Members will be able to fill out the survey either on-line or on paper.

These steps being taken by the Pastoral Search Team will take time, but doing them properly is essential in helping the NALC compile the names of pastors who will match up well with Calvary's goals. Again, prayer is critical. We want to know at the end of this process that we have allowed God to be our leader.

This month, we ask you to read and meditate on Isaiah 40:28-31, which says,

²⁸ Do you not know?

Have you not heard?

The LORD is the everlasting God,
the Creator of the ends of the earth.

He will not grow tired or weary,
and his understanding no one can fathom.

²⁹ He gives strength to the weary
and increases the power of the weak.

³⁰ Even youths grow tired and weary,

They will soar on wings like eagles;

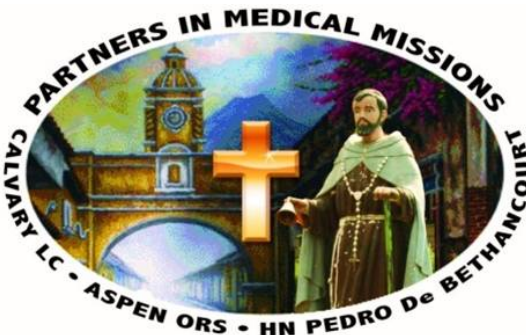

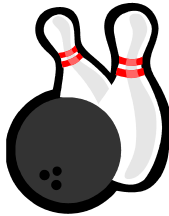


(3rd – 5th grade)

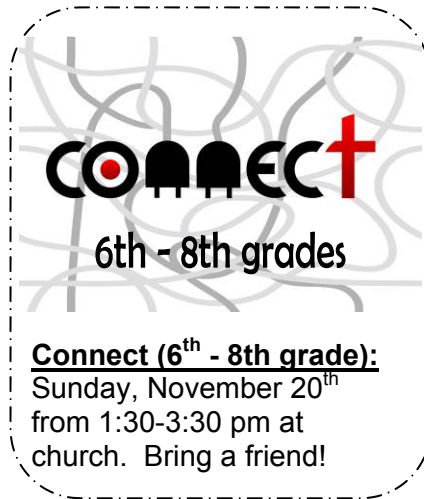


Bridge (3rd – 5th grade):
