"Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers." Galatians 6:10

In the letter to the Galatians, the Apostle Paul primarily addresses a church straying from some of the more important matters of faith he had proclaimed to them, confusing Jewish and Christian rituals and teachings, which is not surprising given Christianity was in its very infancy. Most of his letter concerns these matters. But the last two chapters are different, and they adopt a more positive tone, addressing Christian life – including the famous "*fruits of the Spirit*" in Galatians 5:22-23. Galatians 6 is an appeal to the Christians in Galatia to do good - to everyone of course - but especially to each another. This isn't a particularly novel teaching. But there had been disputes in the church in Galatia which Paul addressed earlier in the letter that had led to some strained relations. He wanted the church to now strive for unity in the faith, and towards one another.

I cite this passage because I am grateful for a new development at Calvary Lutheran Church. At our last Council meeting, members voted to invite another congregation – Holy Cross Anglican – to begin using our building for their worship services and education time on Sunday mornings. Beginning on Sunday, April 28th, the members of Holy Cross will worship at 11:15 a.m. in our sanctuary, and have their Sunday School at 10:30 a.m. in our education wing.

The Pastor (Rector) of Holy Cross, Patrick Malone, approached us last December with the request of his congregation. Formerly "*St. Edmonds Episcopal Church*" of Elm Grove, the congregation was forced to surrender their facility when it voted to leave the Episcopal Church USA several years ago – a difficult process that we at Calvary are all too familiar with. But unlike Calvary who maintained its property, that congregation lost theirs. They have gathered under their new

name at various locations since, most recently at Carroll University in Waukesha.

But that arrangement was growing difficult, so Father Malone reached out to us. I was glad to bring the request to the Council, who were receptive. All the more so, because Holy Cross is now part of a church body known as the Anglican Church North America (ACNA). That church body has a seminary in Ambridge, Pennsylvania, which several years ago welcomed the new North American Lutheran Seminary (NALS) and what, at the time, was just a handful of Lutheran professors and seminarians to its facility, making it much easier for the NALC to have a seminary, even "borrowing" some Anglican faculty to help train future NALC pastors.

So I return to Galatians – '*let us do good to all people, especially those who belong to the household of believers.*' The ACNA did so to our young church body, the NALC. And now Calvary has this wonderful opportunity to do good toward a member of that church body.

This is as it should be. This is the church at its best. And this will not simply be a one way conveyance of goodwill. Holy Cross has fine leadership, and they are eager to bless our congregation. They long to seek opportunities for joint worship with us – something the leadership of the NALC encourages. They long to participate with our wonderful Vacation Bible School, something their size (about 50-60 members) is difficult for them.

Holy Cross will occupy one or two of our Sunday School classrooms each week – ones currently not in use by our Sunday School — for both a children's and adult class. They will worship in their tradition each Sunday, but the Anglican one is not so distant from ours, making the possibility of learning about one another, and joint worship, particularly on festivals such as Christmas and Easter, an intriguing possibility.

This arrangement will be new for us, just as for them. It may, from time to time, call upon us to make use of those "fruits of the Spirit" Galatians lists...love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." We are not merging congregations, but sharing space. That may call upon us at Calvary to make some allowances for our friends, as our particular needs for space may do the same for Holy Cross on occasion. But recalling that our goals are the same - the worship of and service to the Servant King, Jesus Christ - those fruits of that King's Spirit which unites us in faith will surely be there for us.

I am glad to be able to make this announcement to you. In just over a month's time, you will see new faces entering our fine facility – but as Calvary does so well with all our guests, I long to give the members of Holy Cross a genuine Christian welcome. I know you'll be eager to as well.

Mission of the Month/Community Outreach

Mission of the Month: COMPASSION INTERNATIONAL

Compassion International exists as an advocate for children, to release them from their spiritual, economic, social and physical poverty and enable them to become responsible and fulfilled Christian adults.

This is done in a variety of ways. For the Calvary Congregation, we are most familiar with their Water of Life and Child Sponsorship programs.

In prior years, our focus has been on the Water of Life program to purchase water filtration systems. Thankfully, this program has been so successful that there is a limit of how many new systems they need each year. The Water of Life program is part of the larger "WaSH" program which stands for Water Sanitation and Hygiene. Donations directed to WaSH might be used for Water of Life but if all the units have already been acquired for the year, the funds would be used for wells, filtration systems, water storage or sanitation facilities.

The focus of the Water Sanitation and Hygiene initiative (WaSH) is to ensure that no Compassion-assisted child has to drink contaminated water or use unsafe sanitation facilities. Compassion provides the resources and infrastructure that help protect each child's health as they make their journey out of extreme poverty.

Safe-water Infrastructure

Children who have access to safe water are protected from waterborne diseases and are more likely to succeed in school. A nearby safe water source also helps to ensure girls get an education instead of spending hours each day collecting water for their family.

Proper Sanitation

Providing adequate toilets or latrines prevents open defecation, which leads to the rapid spread of disease through communities and puts children in physical danger. Combined with hand-washing facilities, latrines not only protect children's health but foster dignity and self-respect.

Hygiene Education

Compassion provides personal hygiene kits and hygiene education so children can form good habits that will safeguard their health for a lifetime. From basic hand-washing to dental hygiene, Compassion-assisted children learn to care for themselves and lead by example.

Every \$1 invested in Water and Sanitation Priority Initiative creates a \$4 return because whole communities spend less on healthcare and more on education and in the local economy.

The Most Popular Interventions include:

- Drilling wells
- Facilitating waste collection and management
- Providing water filtration systems
- Installing rainwater harvesting systems
- Building water storage and pumping systems

- Providing hygiene education
- Building septic systems
- Training community members on equipment maintenance
- Constructing toilets and washrooms

In fiscal years 2015-18, Compassion's clean water initiatives impacted more than 170,000 Compassion children and their families through the:

- Installation of 8,449 toilets, 874 new water-access points near children's homes and more than 276 hand-washing stations at Compassion church partners.
- Provision of safe water through more than 159 new borehole wells, large water-storage tanks or large-scale water purification systems;
- Distribution of more than 20,400 inhome water filtration systems in 17 countries where Compassion works

Robby Benson and Lynn-Holly Johnson star in this classic story of love triumphing over tragedy.



Come to the media room (Room 110) at 1:00 pm on Monday, April 8 for a final farewell to winter and a good discussion of a delightful book. Bring a friend!



In 2010, the North American Lutheran Church was formed, and in its Confession of Faith is included a "Common Confession", first adopted by the Lutheran Coalition for Renewal (CORE) in 2005. That Common Confession has seven parts and they are:

- The Lord Jesus Christ
- The Gospel of Salvation
- The Authority of Scripture
- A Common Confession of Faith (pertaining to the Lutheran Confessions and other church bodies)
- The Priesthood of All Believers
- Marriage and Family
- The Mission and Ministry of the Congregation.

Sola Publishing, the official publishing house of the NALC, has produced a study guide that will help participants understand the origin and implication of these seven statements. This study resource will form the basis of our sessions and the study guide is available for purchase (not required to participate) for \$10, payable to Calvary Lutheran. 


DINNER + FELLOWSHIP + STUDY
