"O give thanks to the Lord for He is good, for his steadfast love endures forever." Psalm 136

From the Pastor's

This wonderful verse is not the entirety of the Psalm 136, but the phrase "*his steadfast love endures forever*" is spoken 26 times in its 26 verses. The writer of this Psalm invites our praise because the goodness of God in verses 1-3, but then in verse 4 begins to recount the acts of God. In verse 26, the concluding verse, the writer reverts to simply thanking the God of heaven, "*for his steadfast love endures forever*."

In between verses 3 and 26 the Psalm is a review of the Bible – at least as it was known to the writer. Verses 4-9 offers a re-statement of the story of creation with each act of creation accompanied by the refrain "*for his steadfast love endures forever.*" Verses 10-22 is a history of Israel – beginning with the Exodus from Egypt to the inheritance of the promised land, followed by "*for his steadfast love endures forever.*" Finally, verses 23-25 are a recollection of how God remembered Israel in their "low estate", and could refer either to the Exodus again or the return from Babylonian exile.

And this is where the Psalm has room for our personal stories and histories – this is where the Psalm allows us to say; "the Lord remembered me when I was low – for his steadfast love endures forever." And this is also where the Psalm becomes a point of contact for the church, for the foundation of our faith could be articulated in the words of Paul in Romans 5:6-8 says "For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person – though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love us in that while we were sinners Christ died for us.'



*"It is he who remembered us in our low estate...and rescued us from our foes."* Indeed, God has, *"for his steadfast loves endures forever."* This month we begin the season of Lent. Often Lent is associated with solemnity and sacrifice, and they are appropriate for the season. But so is Psalm 136 – the steadfast love of the Lord endures forever and overcomes everything. In fact, the Hebrew word in Psalm 136 translated as "steadfast love" can also mean *"mercy."* 

Years ago, a song by singer Tina Turner aired the frustrations of a woman keeping a relationship with her man (or men) going, and contained the refrain "*what's love go to do with it.*" She grudgingly concluded love had quite a lot to do with 'it'. What's love got to do with Lent? Everything! Christian artist Michael Card once wrote a song entitled "Why" - about the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross, and at one point in the song asked; "*why did they nail his hands and feet, when his love would have held him there*?" Love has everything to do with Lent.

I hope you will plan on observing Lent through our midweek worship services this year, beginning on Wednesday, February 14<sup>th</sup> – Ash Wednesday. Now let's see...what else is that date famous for? Does "love" have anything to do with it? This year we will use the Psalms as our preaching emphasis for the mid-week services. As in years past, we'll have a gathering before worship, beginning that is on February 21<sup>st</sup> at 6:00 PM, with soup suppers hosted by various teams in our congregation.

We will have Lenten devotional materials available to accompany you through the season, and our 12:30 PM Wednesday Bible study group will be utilizing a resource entitled "Why Did Jesus Have to Die – Lessons on the Atonement" by Sola Publishing. If you have not joined us in the past for the Wednesday study, why don't you consider it for Lent? Participant materials are available for \$7, but not required to take part.

Lent is a time of repentance, reflection and renewal and has been practiced by Christians as a 40-day season (excluding Sundays) from the fourth century to the present day. Lent had its roots in baptismal preparation, fasting before celebration of Easter, and renewed baptismal commitment for those who had fallen away from the faith.

Lutherans have often focused their observance on growing deeper in the Word of God, study of Luther's Small Catechism, and reflection on one's sinfulness, repentance and renewal through God's grace and forgiveness. What is important, for Lutherans, is that Lenten observance be seen as a gracious gift for renewal and spiritual refreshment, not a good work to please God or earn His favor.

What Does This Mean?

#### "The Sign of the Cross"

The "sign of the cross" is a physical movement of the hands made when speaking the name of the Trinity the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. This historical tradition is used in many churches as a reminder that God has laid claim to our lives through our Baptism into his name.

In worship, the sign of the cross is often placed upon the people by the pastor, at the same time,

individuals may also trace the sign of the cross over their own heart.

Using the right hand, the first movement is down, from head to stomach (God to us). The second movement traces a "J" down and up to the heart (death to life). The third movement goes across from left to right (me to you).



"The Sign of the Cross" is from Holy Families! an initiative of the North American Lutheran Church provided through a generous grant from the Thrivent Foundation, in honor of the 500th anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation (1517 AD to 2017 AD). Produced by Sola Publishing, this special initiative includes a number of Lutheran discipleship resources for families and congregations.

### February Mission of the Month: LUTHERAN BIBLE TRANSLATORS





Mission and Outreach is facilitating gifts of the Congregation, both monetary and in service, to share the Good News. In February our

focus is on sharing the Good News in Africa. In the early 1900's there were an estimated 9 million Christians in Africa. Today reports show growth to over 500 million. Yet, there are one billion people in Africa. OPPORTUNITY!

Lutheran Bible Translators in partnership with Wycliffe Bible Translators plays a huge role in this growth. Since founded in 1964, Bible translators have brought literacy and Christ's Good News of Salvation to millions. To translate the Bible to "Languages of the Heart" - the language of an indigenous people, requires first learning the language by immersing in the villages. Then CREATING a written language, and finally translating the New Testament into the people's language...of their heart. Currently there are over 80 missionaries translating the New Testament into 26 indigenous languages for Africa. More information is available at www.lbt.org and www.wycliffe.org

Calvary's support of Lutheran Bible Translators included the Federwitz family (Bernie Liedtke's brother Dale's family) and the Burmeister family as they play a large part in the growth and sharing of the Gospel through Lutheran Bible Translators/Wycliffe Bible Translators. Both families have roots in southeast Wisconsin.

The Dale and Alvina Federwitz family began work in Liberia in 1971 and planted missionary seeds with their family. The four Federwitz children continue the work with Danny and Becca (Bernie Liedtke's niece) DeLoach in Papua New Guinea and Jonathan and Carrie Federwitz in Mission Aviation reaching those where roadways are limited. In Ghana, West Africa, Federwitz children David and Paul with their spouses, Valerie and Ali, respectively, serve with Lutheran Bible Translators. Specifically, Paul supports the mission as a computer specialist. Computer technology has significantly reduced from 16-18 years to 10 years the time needed to learn the language, develop the alphabet and literacy program, translate the New Testament, and have the people learn the Good News.

The Jonathan and Nancy Burmeister family committed to move to the Ivory Coast in 1978 and worked with Wycliffe to translate the New Testament into the indigenous languages in the Ivory Coast. Today, Nancy is still helping to recruit new missionaries for translation work and aids with the training of Bible translators.

Our monetary gifts in February support bringing The Good News and literacy to those in great need of hope, love, peace and salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord.
