"Brothers, choose from among you seven men who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom...they choose Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, also Philip, Procorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolas from Antioch... Acts 6:3,5.

"The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ." Ephesians 4:11-12

This month, we are announcing the coming of Stephen Ministry to Calvary. I am delighted to tell you about this and to enter the opening phases of our becoming a Stephen Congregation. Stephen Ministry, which began in 1975 and now involves over 12,000 congregations in America representing over 170 denominations, is a caregiving ministry whose origins are in the infancy of the Christian church, as Acts 6 tells us. Caregiving is a proclamation of the Gospel and, together with the preaching of the Word, is a hallmark of the Church.

The first seven caregivers (also called "Deacons") identified in Acts 6 were invested with their ministry at the consent of the whole church, enabling the Apostles to carry on the ministry of the proclaimed word while Deacons carried out the ministry of compassionate care. In concert with Ephesians 4, Stephen Ministry recognizes that the extension of care in congregations will involve members of the church so gifted – and are often persons who themselves have experienced loss of some kind. That will make them especially equipped to care for others. Stephen Ministers supplement and extend the work of pastors (as our existing Deacon and Communion Visitor ministries do). Stephen Ministers will be given nearly 50 hours of training so that they are both comfortable with caregiving and ready to provide our members with Christ-centered care.

I am delighted that our initial Stephen Ministry Team will be headed up by Scott and Peggy Langelin. They felt the Lord's leading many

months ago to participate in something that could support and bless their congregation, and just a short time later the three of us visited and soon were in agreement that Stephen Ministry was what the Lord was leading them to. The three of us will attend a one week Stephen Leaders Course, February 4-10. Upon our return, we will describe in fuller detail how Stephen Ministry will unfold at Calvary.

As the accompanying information piece indicates, Stephen Ministers provide one on one care. Our members seeking this kind of care will come to me as their pastor, or Scott and Peggy if you so choose. Together we'll prayerfully consider who might be the best person to offer as your Stephen Minister. The relationship is intended to involve weekly contact, and can last for several months up to several years, at the discretion of caregiver and care receiver.

This month we'll include some video testimonials during our worship services so that you know better what the benefits of this ministry can be. But I ask you now to consider a couple of things. Would the Lord be leading you to be a Stephen Minister at Calvary? Faith that Christ the caring Savior will be with you throughout the preparation process and in each caregiving relationship you enter is the only "prerequisite". As Acts 6 says, we seek folks "full of faith" to do this work. That may very well be you. And I ask others to consider if you would like to receive this kind of care — an extension of pastoral care, and extension of a pastor's heart for you. Stephen ministers are my partner in ministry, and I wholly endorse what they do. But it must also be right for you — so please pray over that decision.

As their materials say, "Stephen Ministers are "after people." They are ready to come alongside you, or your friends or relatives — and provide comfort and support for as long after" as needed."

And we at Calvary are anxious to be this...because of a cross,

Bear each another's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ . (Galatians 6:2)

Stephen Ministry is the one-to-one lay caring ministry that takes place in congregations that use the Stephen Series system. Stephen Ministry congregations equip and empower lay caregivers called Stephen Ministers—to provide high-quality, confidential, Christ-centered care to people who are hurting.

The best way to understand how Stephen Ministry works is to learn about three groups of people involved in this ministry: Stephen Leaders, Stephen Ministers, and care receivers.

**Stephen Leaders** establish and direct Stephen Ministry in a congregation. They—

- •build awareness of Stephen Ministry within the congregation and community
- •recruit and train Stephen Ministers
- •meet with potential care receivers to assess their needs
- •match care receivers with Stephen Ministers
- •provide Stephen Ministers with ongoing supervision and continuing education

**Stephen Ministers** are congregation members trained by Stephen Leaders to offer high-quality, one-to-one Christian care to people going through tough times. A Stephen Minister usually provides care to one person at a time.

Care receivers are people—congregation members and others in the community—who receive care from a Stephen Minister. These are people struggling through a difficult time in life—experiencing grief, divorce, job loss, chronic or terminal illness, or some other life crisis.



Take a moment to think of something (or some things) that have been entrusted to you – your family, your resources, your faith. What is your response and your responsibility regarding these things?



God has entrusted us with all these things. But above all, He has entrusted us with His Word, the Good News of eternal life for all who believe in Him. What is our response? What is our responsibility?

In his final letter, St. Paul wrote to Timothy about the gospel message God had entrusted to Timothy and the power He had gifted him so he could carry that message forward. We are also mighty servants who are empowered to continue to spread the Good News.

"God has a plan for you. He has entrusted you with the gospel message and has gifted you to carry it to the furthest reaches of this planet. He's calling you to be His mighty servant, willing to face whatever difficulty you encounter as you carry out His mission." These words are found on the back of the student book for the Beth Moore Bible study entitled "Entrusted". Mosaic is a faith-based organization serving people with intellectual disabilities. They believe that every individual is

a person of worth. Together Mosaic staff members, volunteers and the people we support work as partners. We are passionate about opportunities and partnerships that create meaningful lives, in caring communities, giving a voice to the needs of the people we serve.

Mosaic was formed in 2003 with the merging of Bethpage (founded in Axtell, Neb. In 1913) and Martin Luther Homes (founded in Sterling, Neb. In 1925). Both groups mission was to serve children and adults with disabilities and served locations across the United States. One of the founders of Martin Luther Homes, Pastor Hoeger, stated "We are sisters and brothers in this work. If the angels are glad to serve us and human beings, then how much more should we be thankful and happy that we can also help others who need our help."
