Each year as the church moves from the season of Christmas to that of Epiphany, it reserves a Sunday called "The Baptism of Jesus." Normally I would cite a passage from one of the gospels that record the baptism of Jesus (all four have an account of this event.) The baptism of Jesus is the second major event in the season of Epiphany – a word which means "revealing", the first being the visit of the Magi or Wise Men to the manger.

The baptism of Jesus is not therefore unimportant, but the passage cited above from I Peter tells us that the baptism we receive is not the same. Jesus was baptized, in his own words "to fulfill all righteousness." (Matthew 3:15) He was baptized not to be forgiven, but to be established as one completely obedient to the will of God, one who then could forgive the sins of others. I Peter makes quite clear, baptism, water baptism that is, owes its power to the resurrection of Jesus. We are, as Paul says in Romans 6, "*buried therefore with (him) by baptism into his death, so that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live a new life.*"

Baptism may seem like something we understand quite well – but it's meaning and mystery of how an outward act cannot just signify an inward reality (our faith) but actually accomplish our salvation is not easy to comprehend, and moreover is often debated and by some contested. For that reason, and in response to several of you who asked about baptism last spring when I surveyed you about future sermon topics, I have decided to

dedicate a series of three sermons in January, beginning on the Baptism of our Lord Sunday (January 13) to the questions some of you raised. These included:

What does the Bible say about Baptism?

What is the Biblical basis for infant baptism?

Why do some churches wait for “day of reckoning?”

We'll address these and other important aspects of Christian baptism in our series. Until then, I wanted to share with you a story about a recent baptism at Calvary. Last October, Tiffany and Jackson Schlieve presented two of their daughters for baptism – Ava Lynn and Emma Louise. They joined sister Olivia in the kingdom of God that day, but they were preceded into that kingdom by many others – the folks that Hebrews referred to as “*our great cloud of witnesses*.”

The morning of the baptism when the family arrived, Tiffany told me about the baptismal gowns the girls were wearing that day, and I wanted to share the story with you. Baptism is, as I Peter suggests, “being washed”, but it is also as Galatians 3:27 says “being clothed with Christ.” The baptismal gown, particularly a white one, symbolizes that. The Schlieve baptismal gowns have quite a story. This is an excerpt of what Tiffany wrote me about the gowns...

“Here’s the history of the baptismal gowns. We actually had two in our family - one from my mom’s side (Ellison) and one from my dad’s side (Rogers). In 1946 John and Ellie Ellison had their first child and times were tough with the war. My grandpa (John Ellison) was a fighter pilot in the Air Force in WWII. My grandma took his silk parachute and cut out a pattern and continued to make the special dress. My mom and all of her sisters (my aunts) have been baptized in this dress. It has been a tradition to hand it down for grandchildren and great-grandchildren to wear on their special day. The gown is 72 years old. As far as my children, Olivia and Emma were both baptized in it.

From the Rogers’ side.: When my papa’s (grandpa- Sion Rogers) mother died, papa and Gaga (my grandma-Virginia Rogers) received a trunk with a lot of papa’s infant dresses inside. Infants back then, even the boys, wore the long Irish linen gowns. My mom and dad (Cocoa and Mark Rogers) got one of the dresses and a bonnet, thinking it was so special and perfect for a baptismal gown. It just so happened that mostly the boys in our family wore this gown on their baptismal day. The gown is over 108 years old.”

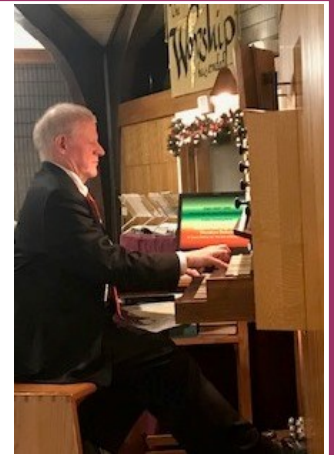
In writing about baptism and daily life in his Small Catechism, Martin Luther wrote “*day by day a new self should arise to live with God in righteousness and purity forever.*” This is what we receive when we and our children are baptized. This promise and its power is conveyed one generation at a time. What we wear on our baptismal day may be new or in its 4th generation, but what we are clothed in is Christ.

Mosaic is a faith-based organization serving people with intellectual

disabilities. They believe that every individual is a person of worth. Together Mosaic staff members, volunteers and the people we support work as partners. We are passionate about opportunities and partnerships that create meaningful lives, in caring communities, giving a voice to the needs of the people we serve.

Mosaic was formed in 2003 with the merging of Bethpage (founded in Axtell, Neb. in 1913) and Martin Luther Homes (founded in Sterling, Neb. in 1925). Both groups mission was to serve children and adults with disabilities and served locations across the United States. One of the founders of Martin Luther Homes, Pastor Hoeger, stated "We are sisters and brothers in this work. If the angels are glad to serve us and human beings, then how

much more should we be thankful and happy that we can also help others who need our help."

Reverend Ted and Marion Youngquist first introduced Bethpage to Calvary when Pastor Youngquist was an Interim Pastor some 25+ years ago. Ted and Marion were students at Midland College in Fremont, Nebraska in the 1940's when they first encountered Bethpage. Pastor Ted and Marion have generously supported Bethpage and now Mosaic ever since. In his retirement, Pastor Ted delighted in telling the Mosaic story and our Mission and Outreach Committee is proud to keep telling Ted's story and his commitment to organizations like Mosaic.

- Fred Rogers received more than **40 honorary degrees** from colleges and universities.



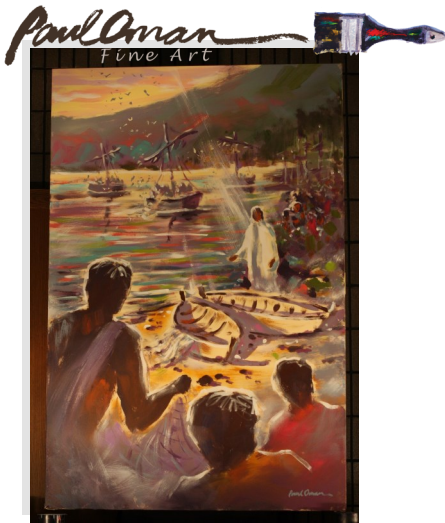
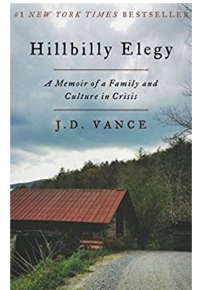

STEPHEN MINISTRY UPDATE

"Stephen Ministry has had a definite impact on our church's growth. Quite a few people have joined our congregation after receiving care from a Stephen Minister – care they may not otherwise have received."

"There's no way I could minister to so many without Stephen Ministers. They are my most valued lay partners in the one to one care of our parishioners. Stephen Ministry truly expresses what it means to care for one another in the body of Christ."

These quotations come from pastors in congregations with Stephen Ministry. I doubt I could say it any better – Stephen Ministry is a blessing to Calvary congregation. I have listened to both care receivers and care givers tell me how thankful they are for it. In March our leadership team – which includes me, Scott and Peggy Langelin, established goals for 2018 which included holding our first training class, preparing our membership to receive Stephen Ministry, and begin the process of reaching outside our congregation through our 'SM'.

I am happy to say the first of these goals were accomplished when 7 new ministers were commissioned this fall, and just this past month our 4th Calvary member began receiving care. Moreover, we are making plans for our second 50 hour training session in early January, with two applicants already expressing a desire to receive training. If you too are interested in becoming a Stephen Minister, contact one of us.

But I also write to ask your help. Stephen Ministry can and we believe should impact others outside our congregation. We have always intended our ministry be something we offer through our members to hurting people you may know – and I ask you take the opportunity if it presents itself to tell someone about Stephen Ministry, or urge them to contact me.

SM is a wonderful growth opportunity for our members who become ministers, and we are confident the very thing needed by other Calvary members who've experienced a loss in their life. But we want to throw our Christian arms open wide in 2019, so please consider taking some of the information from the 'SM' Kiosk in the entry of the church or that has been placed in pews of our sanctuary, and refer someone to us. You will be telling them how much you care, and while we certainly never expect someone will (or needs to) become a member of Calvary if they become a care receiver, Stephen Ministry is *our* ministry, it is a reflection of who we are and what we ourselves experience from God – persistent, tender mercy. It is therefore a great tool for congregational growth.

We want, as with all our ministries, to reach beyond ourselves. Help us please, by telling others about how Calvary congregation, through Stephen Ministry, is committed to Christ centered, compassionate care.

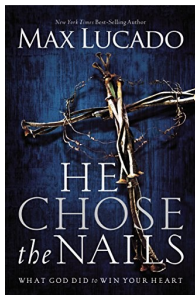

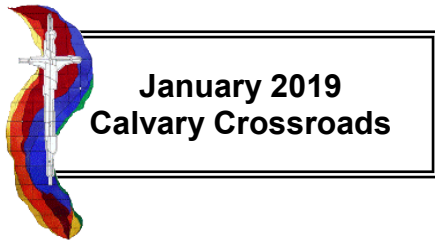
