"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Matthew 27:46
"Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." Luke 23:46

Last month I began writing about **"The Seven Habits of Discipleship"**. I wrote that although we commonly hear the word "disciple" in the church, we don't really have a precise definition outside of the general understanding that disciple means *"follower of Jesus"* – someone who learns from, or who listens to, Jesus and tries to line up their life with his teachings.

In John 8:31-32 Jesus said *"If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."* Disciples are believers who "hold" to Jesus' teaching. Trying to unpack what it means "to hold" to Jesus' teaching however can be hard. So I suggest the following signs or "habits" that will help us to be informed and effective followers of Jesus.

- Worship weekly
- Pray daily
- Read and study the Bible regularly
- Seek to live your faith in daily life
- Seek the supporting relationship of other Christians
- Grow in giving toward the goal of tithing
- Learn to share faith with others

The second *"habit"* is prayer. Precisely where prayer originated in Scripture is hard to pin down. The Old Testament has numerous references to men and women talking with God – from Adam and Eve in the garden, to Moses on the mountain, to Abraham "bargaining with God" over the fate of Sodom and Gomorrah, to Job asking God for answers to his suffering. And while the circumstances all vary, conversation with God on a one-to-one basis is common and not limited to times of communal worship.

But it is the Psalms that provide the most common forms of prayer in the Bible. While most Psalms were written for communal worship, Jesus clearly used them for personal prayer. From the cross, Jesus twice prays – first asking God why he suffered, quoting Psalm 22:1, and then entrusting God with his dying breath, quoting Psalm 31:5. I encourage you to read these two Psalms as they offer excellent examples of how to pray. What is clear is that prayer was important to Jesus – it kept him in touch with his Father, and he commands us to do likewise. In Luke 11, Jesus’ offers a lesson in prayer, having been questioned about it by a disciple who had watched Jesus praying. “*When you pray*”, Jesus said, “*say; Father, hallowed be your name.*”

I’m not going to attempt to improve on “The Lord’s Prayer”, but I will suggest that our prayers go beyond that one wonderful example. John 17 – yes the *entire* chapter – is another version so to speak of “our Lord’s prayer.” Jesus on the eve of his death prays for himself, his disciples, and the future church — requests that all come in the form of honest conversation. It’s a splendid example of how to pray. It takes on serious subjects but never fails to praise God nor express quiet confidence that “God’s will” indeed will be done ‘*on earth as it is in heaven*’.

In my confirmation class this past year, we studied prayer, and I introduced the kids to one of those ubiquitous acronyms to help shape our prayer. I encouraged them to pray by “*taking a trip*” with God. When we pray (as Jesus always did), we begin by making sure we greet the one to whom we pray. In case there is any doubt about who our God is, the best way to begin prayer is address the one to whom Jesus prayed – “*Father.*” A daily “*trip* with God” might include a prayer that includes the following:

A ddress—Father, Dear Lord, Loving God — all the names of God are holy.

T hanks—No better place to enter into a conversation with God than with gratitude. “Hallowed be thy name” is how Jesus said it.

R epentance—This could also be called the “regrets” part of a prayer. We have no record of Jesus including repentance in his prayers, but Jesus’ prayers were honest. His Garden of Gethsemane prayer in John 17:12, for example, included a statement about “losing” Judas.

I ntercession—Who needs your prayers? We have a list each week in our bulletin. You may not know these folks, but God does. Jesus’ prayer in John 17 is, in fact, mostly intercessory, praying for his disciples, the Church and the world.

P etition—Finally, what do you need? Jesus prayed for himself. “*Father, glorify me in your presence with the glory I had with you before the world began*” is what John 17:5 says. And of course, the agony of his plea in Matthew 27:46 is one of the most expressive forms of petition – ‘God...why?’

We pray in other words,
Because of a cross,

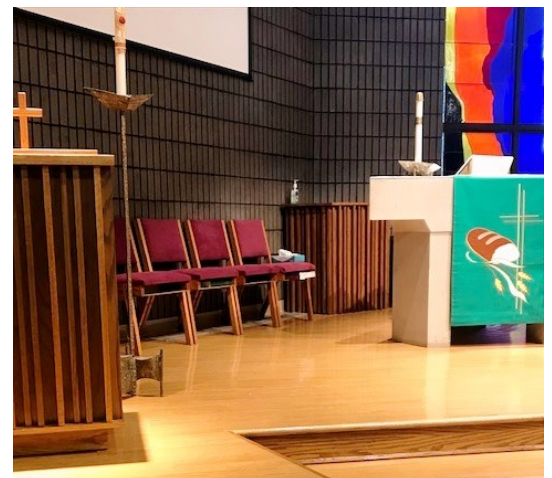

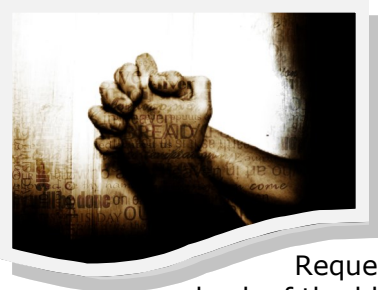
