Pastor, what happens when you die? This hardly seems a topic for springtime, when everything around us is bursting with life. owing to the frequency with which I am asked this guestion and the differing points of view I have heard expressed by members of my congregations as well as pastoral colleagues, it's clearly an issue that The simple answer is that for the Christian, we folks think about. pass from the confines of earthly life to heavenly life. That simple truth - the "what happens" question is never in dispute. But the "when does this change occur" question is not as clear. biblical support, such as in our passage from Luke, that the instant Lutheran tradition has consistently held we die we enter heaven. that if a person is to inherit eternal life - enter the "Kingdom of Heaven" that is, the moment of death determines that. It's our "now or never moment" you might say.

This passage from Luke of course pertains to the moment of Jesus' own death, and involves a unique conversation about dying. Folks ask "well, if Jesus says "today, you will be with me in paradise" does that mean that when we die we immediately enter the company of Jesus"? The best I can say is "yes", and "in a matter of speaking". When we die, we bury our bodies in the ground in the "sure and"

certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life". But our graves are occupied until Jesus calls us forth from them. Our soul is freed, to be reunited one day with what Paul in I Corinthians 15 calls "our heavenly body". That still awaits – as Paul says, the "trumpet sound" when the dead will be raised as eternal bodies, and we will be changed. No one, aside from Jesus, has been so resurrected. Not yet.

It may be helpful for us to think of it this way - when we die, we, like the grass of the field, fade away. We change, and then again, not entirely. I don't want to press the metaphor too far, but we folks in Northern climates know about such things – we know all about grass that for a time is dormant and then springs to life. When we die our earthly bodies "go dormant" – they become "lifeless", yet they retain the promise and potential for new life – because as I Peter says, the word of the Lord that was announced to you and received in you. That promise and potential is our faith in the good news of Jesus Christ. When the right conditions exist, we will live - be vibrant again. Those "conditions' will take place when the Lord Jesus returns in glory and time as we know it ends.

To think of it perhaps one other way, when we die, we move from 'minute by minute time' to "forever". For those who die in Christ, as the thief on the cross, the next conscious thought we will have is heaven...paradise. Let me offer an analogy from my own past experience. When we would take a family vacation, our young girls were filled with anticipation. "When can we leave...when does our vacation start"? To calm them down a bit....and to get to bed myself, I usually said "vacation starts the minute you close your eyes and fall asleep". Once they fall asleep, the next conscious thought they will have is dad or mom telling them "it's time to leave". Vacation has started. But then really, for them, it started when they nodded off the night before.

When we die in Christ, we, as our funeral liturgy proclaims, enter "the blessed rest of everlasting peace" and the next conscious thought someone has is eternity...timelessness. Jesus said "today" to the thief and meant it. The man would die that day. And when he did, the next thing he would realize is eternity with God because of the good news proclaimed to him by Jesus. His final resurrection awaited – it was as Paul says in I Corinthians 15 a wait that will end "when the trumpet sounds and the dead in Christ will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed". But it was and is a "blessed rest of everlasting peace" wait. Ours will be as well...because of a cross.

I wish you a very pleasant start of summer, with all its abundant life.

Pentecost is the festival when Christians celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and is on June 4th this year. It is celebrated on the Sunday 50 days after Easter (the name comes from the Greek pentekoste, "fiftieth").



The Season after Pentecost begins the day after Pentecost and ends the day before the First Sunday of Advent. It may include twenty—three to twenty—eight Sundays, depending on the date of Easter, but the first Sunday is always Holy Trinity Sunday (June 11), and the last Sunday is always Christ the King Sunday (Nov. 26). The season also includes All Saints and Thanksgiving.

Although the scripture lessons for this half of the year go in a semi-continuous cycle through books of the Bible rather than follow a theme, the gospel lessons cover Jesus' teaching ministry.




