11 Serving at Worship

"There are different kinds of gifts but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds of service but the same Lord."

1 Corinthians 12:4-5 (NIV)

When I see a good article, I not only read it, I adopt it! With full credit to my wife Marcella, who is a Council member of the Women of the North American Lutheran Church (WNALC), I relay to you her thoughts on service for this month that we at Calvary dedicate as our Mission Servant Month.

In a recent sermon, (May 19th) I made the following remarks in relation to Martin Luther's explanation to the 1st Article of the Apostle's Creed – (*I believe* in God the Father...creator of heaven and earth") where, because of what God our Creator has done for us, Luther said "we surely *ought* to thank, praise, serve and obey him."

In that sermon, I said "Most of (Lutheran) worship is about what God has done for us, and only at the very end (of the worship time), when told to 'go in peace to love and serve the Lord", do we even hint at a response – what we might (and ought) do for God. The words "thank and praise" suggest come to church on Sunday morning worship. But "serve and obey" are about that very tail end of worship and press the question "How are you going to represent the name of Jesus Christ after you put your bulletin down, turn your sermon notes in, close the hymn book, and answer those words "go in peace, serve the Lord" with the customary Lutheran response "thanks be to God!" Thanks be to God are words of worship. We ought to do quite a bit of serving, but if it's not in response to what God has done for us nor done with thankfulness – it's simply not an act of worship.

June provides a fabulous opportunity for you to add something to your worship – maybe something new, maybe an old familiar friend – but our Mission and Outreach Committee has assembled numerous opportunities at various times, involving "different gifts." Please visit the sign-up sheets posted on the window entering the fellowship hall to review, and commit to one (or more).

From the Pastor's Pen (continued)

What follows are some of Marcella's thoughts that she has presented to the WNALC;

"What's your mission? Have you considered what God has gifted you to do and calls you to do in response to His abundant grace? What might you support through your offerings? What activities can you give your time to? Is there something you can do together at your church? Is there something you can do from your home if it is harder for you to get to an activity at church? Do you like to visit people, bake, sew, build, or do yard work? Some are good at shopping, so fill your cart for NALC disaster response items, Lutheran World Relief, your local food pantry or crisis center. Could you give away some extra possessions? Find an organization to share your abundance with.

I serve on the Mission and Outreach committee in our congregation, Calvary Lutheran of Brookfield, Wisconsin. Each month we choose a different mission to support with a special offering. These missions are local, national and international. Our goal is to give people opportunities to respond to the variety of mission groups, knowing that different opportunities appeal to different people and we are pleased our congregation has an enthusiastic response to these choices.

Also, at Calvary, we designate the month of June as Mission Servant Month. During the month the focus for most of the activities is outreach beyond the walls of our church. This, too, has a good response from our members... I hope our list from Calvary gives you some ideas to inspire an outreach project in your congregation. Read 1 Corinthians 12. This chapter is a good teaching for us all. "There are different kinds of gifts but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds of service but the same Lord." 1 Corinthians 12:4-5."

Please look over the complete list of servant opportunities on pages 4-5 of this newsletter. One final thought. I recently received a mailing from what I assume is a new congregation in our area. They billed themselves as a "different kind of Christian community" in that they held a worship service two Sundays a month, and the other Sundays in place of worship in their building they went out into the community and did servant work.

I confess being both intrigued by their approach, but at the same time a little mystified by their suggestion (maybe not intended) that they were not just "worshipping" Christians like everyone else, but "serving" Christians - which is a false distinction to make. Service is worship, yes, but Christian service that does not arise out of devotion to and praise of Christ is just another activity. I'm thankful that Calvary knows this – and earnestly unites the two throughout the year but especially during our Mission Servant Month. I commend to you the joy of serving.

Mission of the Month LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF AND NALC DISASTER RESPONSE FUND



The **NALC DISASTER RESPONSE FUND** provides resources for rapid response when domestic natural disasters occur, alleviates human suffering, provides transitional assistance and enables those affected to begin the rebuilding process. The NALC's Disaster Response Coordinator administers the use of the Fund, working cooperatively with and through local NALC congregations and members, as well as other compatible disaster relief organizations such as LCMS Disaster Response.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF (LWR) works with 100 local partners to improve harvests, health and education in 35 countries each year. These LWR partners train local women and men to produce local foods, dig low-cost wells and protect and restore their local environments. Some partners are small village groups on the edge of the Sahara. Others are nationwide programs that may reach across the Andes.
