#### John 17:20

Lent begins March 1<sup>st</sup> this year. I do hope you will join us for our Ash Wednesday service that day at 7:00 PM. Lent is often thought of as a time of relinquishing or "giving something up." But it is important to add vital things to our lives in observance of Lent, in the hope and expectation that these practices will become habitual. Please make every effort to experience the start of Lent in the beautiful and solemn worship of Ash Wednesday.

Please come for Wednesday worship the remaining five weeks of Lent as well. 2017 is the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation – marking five centuries since an Augustinian Monk named Martin Luther challenged some of the teachings of the church so as to reform it, but also lifted up the importance of teaching ourselves and our young the faith so as to reform our homes. One of his great gifts to the church and to its families was his Small Catechism – a simple summary of the Christian faith that even his detractors admitted was of great value.

All our Lenten services will emphasize one of the six parts of Luther's Small Catechism. Come to discover something new, come to refresh your confirmation memories, but above all come to devote yourselves again to these timeless truths.

I have referred above to a passage from John 17 - a portion of a prayer of Jesus. Many think he spoke these words in the Garden of Gethsemane the night before his death. The other gospel writers, Matthew, Mark and Luke, all record Jesus - in the night in which he was betrayed - praying for his own strength and that if possible he might be spared his suffering. John alone records a quite extended prayer of our Lord for...us. I encourage you to read John 17 at some point during Lent. It would make a particularly good

form of preparation for your Holy Week observance. The faith of future generations depends on the faith of current ones. Luther understood that well – it motivated him to write his Catechism.

In our traditional Lutheran liturgy, in the section of the worship service we call "*The Kyrie*" a Greek word meaning "*Lord Have Mercy*" we have a prayer petition that says...

"For the peace of the whole world, for the well being of the church of God, and for the unity of all, let us pray to the Lord"

In speaking these words we are in essence praying "the Lord's Prayer" - the Lord's Prayer according to John 17 that is. As I said earlier, in Lent, we tend to focus inward - we seek to rid ourselves of habits of the heart and mind that may taint our "message" - our witness that we may (or may not) believe the message of the gospel. We might strive to become a bit more tolerant of other's sins too, recognizing they may arise from their own personal struggles and weaknesses, and pray for them also.

But never forget that the "message" you express is never simply a spiritual one. If we allow ourselves even for a moment to define "spiritual" narrowly as the use of religious language in conversation we miss the mark. The larger message of "the peace for the whole world and the well being of the church of God" through our very lives is a marvelous thought. It also makes for a potent prayer. The sheer fact that Jesus is praying for "your message" and that others may believe in Him through "your message" ought to give you confidence that it is not a prayer spoken in vain.

The "Lord's Prayer" of John 17 is indeed for the church and its message. But that means it is also for you and your family and the daily message of faith you express in all your callings in life. I am sure you will find our time spent recalling the basics of our faith will be time well spent. I wish you a meaningful season of Lent.

#### A Refresher & Introduction to Lent at Calvary Lutheran Church

**What is Lent?** As early as the mid-fourth century, Christians have observed a time of preparation before the Easter celebration. The word itself - Lent - probably comes from an old Anglo-Saxon word that means to "lengthen," acknowledging that the advancing Spring also brings lengthening days.

The Lenten season begins on **Ash Wednesday** (this year, March 1) and lasts for **40 days**. The forty days of Lent recall the 40 day fast of Jesus in the wilderness after his baptism (Matthew 4:2, Luke 4:1-2) and Moses' 40 day fast on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:28). It is a time of simplicity and preparation.

What's the point of Lent? As the earth is being renewed from its winter slumber with advancement of Spring, so too, Lent has been a time of renewal within the life of many Christians. Some common themes associated with this renewal are:

- **Penitence** that is, a desire to repent, to be different, to be renewed.
- **Baptismal renewal** being keenly aware of the promises of love, grace, and forgiveness God has made to us in baptism AND of our responsive action through acts of love and mercy, thus the next theme . . .
- **Prayer, fasting, and service** Not just talking the talk, but walking the walk.
- **Confession of sin** Both confessing our fallenness AND being rooted in the promise of forgiveness from God that come through the cross of Christ.

A good way of thinking about Lent might be in terms of exercise or physical fitness: Lent is a time of getting rid of the flab and getting fit with regards to our faith and Christian practice. Lent is the point of which the couch potato says, "Ok, it's time to get serious."

I have heard of people "giving something up" for Lent. Is that what's going on - some sort of spiritual fitness test? Yes, that's certainly one way of looking at it. Some Christians, as part of their Lenten exercise, do give up something for Lent: alcohol, meat, or chocolate are simple pleasures that many people often give up as a Lenten discipline. Giving up peas would be no sacrifice for those who hate peas. The sacrifice should be something that produces a noticeable absence.

The theological basis for this is simple: Every time we want what we have given up, we are reminded of what Christ gave up for us. Christ gave his life. While our sacrifice pales in comparison, it serves as a frequent reminder of God's overwhelming and complete love for each of us in our season of preparation for the resurrection. Other Christians find this "giving up" business rather trite - especially for such "small" things as chocolate or sweets. (There are children starving in Africa does God really



care if you gave up chocolate?) Instead, some Christians ADD something to their daily lives - prayer . . . an extra offering gift . . . charity work . . . etc. - as a part of their "spiritual fitness" plan.

Whether one give something up or adds something to the mix, it is VITAL to remember that NONE of these things should be seen as "brownie points" that somehow offset our human sinfulness. God's greatest gift to this end is the gift of forgiveness, this belief given to us through Scripture that Jesus's sinless death at the hands of sinful men serves as the guilt payment for human sin. <u>Our spiritual fitness plans are only beneficial in as much as they draw us closer in our love and devotion to God and to our neighbor.</u>

# Will I recognize any difference in worship at Calvary Lutheran Church?

Hopefully, yes - there are a number of things to watch and listen for as signs of Lent here at Calvary.

- **Purple** is the color of the altar cloths, suggesting somberness and solemnity.
- Ash Wednesday and its "imposition of ashes" also suggest this "time to get serious about my faith and practice approach,." Why ashes? It's as if to say, "Remember, you're not going to be here forever - why not tend to

these things of deep importance now while you can?"

- Simplicity of worship all of our worship services will tend to be a bit simpler in their order.
- Added opportunities for worship and study - mid week Lenten services on Wednesday as well as the Pastor's Bible Study at noon on Wednesdays.
