In Lent, the church is called to repentance and renewal of faith. Repentance means to “turn around or away from.” Renewal means “to take up again, resume, restore or to make new”. The emphasis is on our sins and the call to repent of them and through repentance and forgiveness resume a right relationship with God and one another. As David says in Psalm 51:12 “Restore to me the joy of your salvation.” The restoring comes through Jesus’ death on the cross, just as it acts as the impetus for our repentance. As Paul wrote in Romans 6 – “We are therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life.”

What is this “new life.” Answers could vary, but a significant indication of what this life is intended to be like is contained in our Lord’s “high priestly prayer” in John 17 – sometimes referred to as “the other Lord’s Prayer” where Jesus prays for himself on the eve of his crucifixion, his current followers, and future believers. It is marked by many references to Jesus and his followers “being one” or united. To say the least, as a “unity” prayer, John 17 has not effectuated the life he longed his church to know. We are a divided body, if our many “denominations”, doctrinal, ethical and worship differences are any indication.

We will devote our Wednesday night Lenten messages to our Lord’s “High Priestly Prayer” in John 17 as well as Paul’s letter to the Ephesians – which is the most extensive letter of Paul’s on the question of the church and it’s unity. Our goal is to examine how passionate our Lord was not only to save us from our sins, but preserve his church and keep it united with Jesus in the one true faith. Join us on Wednesdays at 6:30 p.m. The weekly focus will be:

- March 4: John 17:1-5 & Ephesians 1:1-13 “Unity in the Father, Unity in the Son”
- March 11: John 17:6-12 & Ephesians 2:1-10 “Covered in Grace - Surrounded by Sin”
- March 18: John 17:13-18 & Ephesians 2:19-22 “Unity in the Truth and Only the Truth”
- March 25: John 17:20-23 & Ephesians 4:17-32 “When Unity is Fractured and Others Turn Away”
- April 1: John 17:24-26 & Ephesians 6:10-17 “The Unity of Savior and Saved – Putting on the Holy Spirit”

WHAT DO WE MEAN BY FAITH FORMATION?

Many big changes have happened this year in Faith Formation at Calvary. Not the least of which was the merger of two committees. The Christian Education Committee and the Youth and Family Ministry Committee have combined to serve Calvary as the Faith Formation Committee. With that, I felt I would spend some time here explaining what we mean by *faith formation*.

The definition of faith has become misunderstood in American Christianity. For many, it has become a thing we work up inside of us through study, deliberation, and maybe church attendance and prayer by which we believe in God, trust in him and get saved. This idea of faith puts it in the "works" category- something we do. But faith is not something you or I do. Nor is faith in God something we can do. It is a gift from God, the Holy Spirit, most notably given to us through Word and Sacrament.

Faith (and its synonym, belief) is a term of relationship. It needs an object. We have faith in someone or believe in something. As a term of relationship, it can be thought of as having three parts: knowledge, agreement, and trust. First, there is knowledge or the content of faith. In Christianity, Jesus is the content of our faith, the

Son of God, crucified and risen for the forgiveness of sins. Second, there is agreement or approval of the content. For Christians, that would be agreeing that Jesus *really* did die and rise from the dead, that it actually happened. Third, there is a trust or heartfelt confidence that what you know and agree is true applies to you. For us, this means believing that Jesus was crucified and risen for *your* sins.

This third part, trust, is what we most often mean by faith, and believing that Jesus died *for me* is not something I can come to trust on my own. This trust, this heartfelt confidence in Christ's work on my behalf, is a gift from God. It is one he works in us by his word. As Paul writes in Romans, "Faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ" (Romans 10:17).

It is this word of Christ, that is, the word that our sins are forgiven because of Jesus' death and resurrection, that we strive to lift up, share, and teach with the children, students, parents, and adults of Calvary. Faith formation is not something we do per se. It is something we join Jesus in doing. He has given us faith in him by his word and so, like John the Baptist, we point Jesus out to others saying, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29).

That is what faith formation is ... continually sharing what has been given to us: The good news that our sins are freely forgiven in Christ. It is out of this forgiveness that hopes springs and by this forgiveness that lives change.

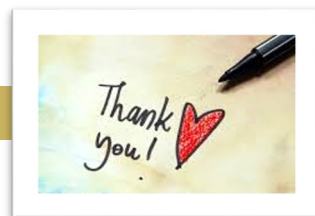


A wee bit o' green ... beans, peas, spinach, etc. are the items requested for our next Food Sunday, with collection on March 15.

CALVARY MINISTRY INTEREST INDICATOR SUMMARY RESULTS

Thank you to those of you who took the time to complete the online Ministry Interest Indicator survey last fall. This collection tool was created and made available to Calvary members to guide us in **“SERVING OUR LORD BY SERVING OUR CHURCH”**. Below is a summary of the results:

- ◆ Question #10 asked for an indication of preferred Sunday worship time. Of the 50 responses to this question, the current 9:00 a.m. start time was chosen by 88% of the respondents and a delayed start time of 9:30 a.m. was chosen by 12%.
- ◆ All Ministry teams received new volunteers, indicating an interest to serve at almost a 100% rate of the survey participants. This is indeed encouraging! The names of new volunteers were distributed to the teams, and many have begun their service.

“WHAT ARE SOME THINGS ABOUT CALVARY THAT WE SHOULD CELEBRATE?” Responses included:

- ◇ The Holy Spirit being present and active in this congregation!
- ◇ Friendliness, welcoming, good worshiping, The welcoming warmth of our members.

- ◇ Singing participation, children helping with ushering and offering, Alleluia Choir, Celebration Ringers, Kyle Jones and youth programs,

Stephens Ministry, Sunday School and men’s/ women’s adult Bible studies

- ◇ Skilled preaching - loving congregation
- ◇ Sound Biblical preaching - friendly congregation, good spirit in congregation
- ◇ Pastoral leadership is excellent, lots of emotional and spiritual support for members

“WHAT ARE SOME THINGS WE SHOULD BE DOING AT CALVARY?” Responses included:

- ◇ Continue to make Calvary more visible in our communities.
- ◇ More children’s music
- ◇ Consider possibility of two worship service times on Sunday and phasing out Saturday service.
- ◇ Slow down serving communion for people who need more time to kneel because of physical disabilities.
- ◇ More Small Group formation
- ◇ We should develop more programs that would encourage our youth and young adults to be involved with music at Calvary. Holidays should have special music ... just another worship service now.
- ◇ Continue to add families and youth.
- ◇ More family events, youth activities other than monthly meetings, intergenerational ministry/ events. Children’s music ministry

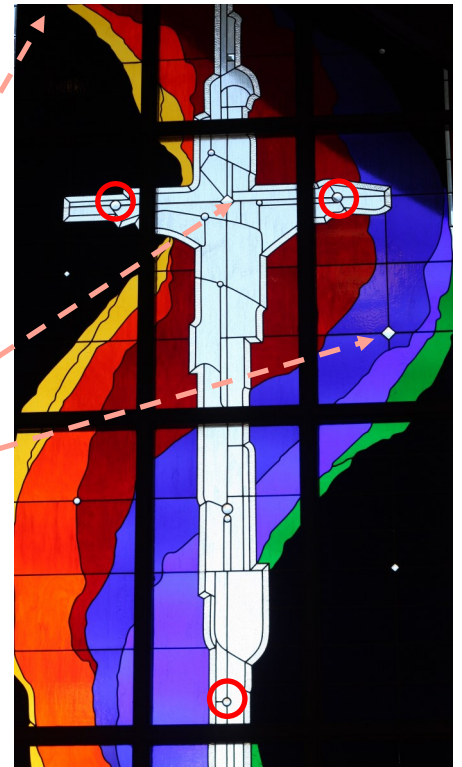


DID YOU KNOW?

Our beautiful stained glass window, themed as “**THE SPIRIT OF THE CROSS**” was created by Minnesota native and Master stained-glass artist Robert Uchner. Bob studied stain glass design at the Fachhochschule in Krefeld, West Germany. While obtaining his Master’s degree, he was selected as one of West Germany’s best stained glass craftsmen in the national bi-yearly publication “*Junges Handwerk Ausstellung*”. He secured the title of “Master Craftsman” and studied at Dusseldorf’s State Academy of Art for one year under Professor Joseph Beuys who was one of the most important avantgarde artists in Germany. Following college he returned to open his studio in Waukesha. Bob passed away in 2012 at the age of 69.

The story of this stained glass is “**The Blood of Man**” and was designed to mirror the large cross which hangs over our altar. Take a close look at the window and you’ll notice the following:

- ♦ The Trinity is represented by the three large 3” jewels
- ♦ The rainbow represents God’s promise.
- ♦ The red border around the entire window represents the blood of man.
- ♦ The wounds of Jesus are represented by the large round jewels at the feet and arms of the cross
- ♦ The row of jewels along the bottom represent the earth.



The window was dedicated in April of 1990.

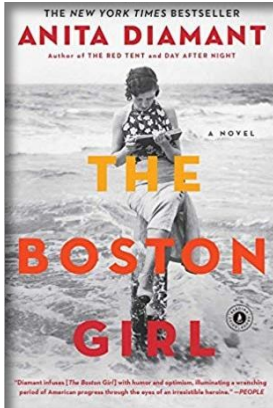

Anita Diamant's "vivid, affectionate portrait of American womanhood" (Los Angeles Times), follows the life of one woman, Addie Baum, through a period of dramatic change. Addie is The Boston Girl, the spirited daughter of an immigrant Jewish family, born in 1900 to parents who were unprepared for America and its effect on their three daughters.

Growing up in the North End of Boston, then a teeming multicultural neighborhood, Addie's intelligence and curiosity take her to a world her parents can't imagine - a world of short skirts, movies, celebrity culture, and new opportunities for women. Addie wants to finish high school and dreams of going to college. She wants a career and to find true love.

From the one-room tenement apartment she shared with her parents and two sisters, to the library group for girls she joins at a neighborhood settlement

house, to her first, disastrous love affair, to finding the love of her life, eighty-five-year-old Addie recounts her adventures with humor and compassion for the naïve girl she once was.

There will be cake and coffee, so please plan on stopping by Fellowship Hall.

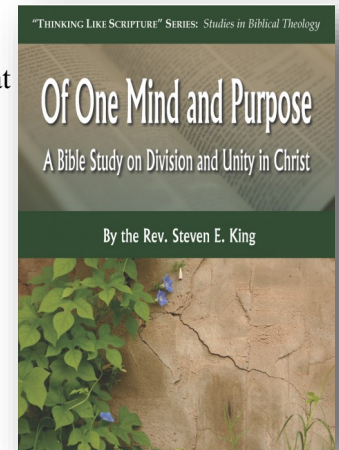


FAITH FORMATION

3. “Walking Together – Mutual Dependence”
4. “Divisions Among You – False and Fractured Unity”
5. “Hard Choices – Facing Crossroads in Faith”

It was a fun evening of great food and fellowship. Congratulations to our two winners, JoAnne Krause and Lydia Trudell!



JOANNE'S CHILI (JoAnne Krause)

2 lbs. ground beef	Large can tomato puree
2 Tbsp flour	Tomato juice to desired consistency
2-3 Tbsp chili powder	3/4 cup chopped onion (microwave 1-1/2 minutes)
Garlic salt, salt & pepper to taste	1 Tbsp sugar
2 cans kidney beans	2 medium bay leaves



Brown and drain ground beef. Using low heat, stir in flour, chili powder, garlic, salt and pepper to taste. Add kidney beans, can of tomato puree, tomato juice (to desired consistency), onion, sugar and bay leaves.

Simmer 1-1/2 hours. Remove bay leaves before serving.

For maximum flavor, prepare the day before serving.

LASAGNE SOUP (Lydia Trudell)

1-1/2 lbs. ground chuck	1/2 tsp garlic salt
1 onion, chopped	1/2 tsp crushed red pepper
1 green bell pepper, chopped	2 bay leaves
3 gloves garlic, minced	2 cups small bow tie pasta
1 (32 oz.) carton beef broth	1/2 cup heavy whipping cream
1 (14.5 oz.) cans petite diced tomatoes	1 cup ricotta cheese
1 (15 oz.) can tomato sauce	1 cup grated Parmesan cheese
2 tsp dried oregano	3 tablespoons sour cream
2 tsp dried basil	
(Makes about 3 quarts)	



1. In a large Dutch oven, cook beef, onion, bell pepper, and garlic over medium-high heat, stirring occasionally, until beef is browned and crumbly, 8 to 10 minutes; drain well.

2. Stir in broth, tomatoes, tomato sauce, oregano, basil, garlic salt, red pepper, and bay leaves, and bring to a boil over medium-high heat. Reduce heat, and simmer for 15 minutes. Stir in pasta, and cook until tender, about 10 minutes. Remove from heat, and stir in cream.

3. In a medium bowl, stir together ricotta, Parmesan and sour cream. Slowly stir into soup until completely combined. Heat through.
