"He has been raised from the dead and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee, there you will see him. This is my message for you." Matthew 28:7

Each year on Good Friday, I sit down and read through one of the four gospel versions of the trial and crucifixion of Jesus, but then I read all four accounts of his resurrection. (I guess I like the ending more than the beginning of that story!) Even though Easter is technically past (though the season of Easter continues until early June) I encourage you to read the resurrection accounts as a personal devotion. One of the interesting things about the stories of the resurrection is the subtle differences in each. There is no doubt that all four writers, Matthew, Mark, Luke and John are describing the same event - their Lord's resurrection. But each contain little nuances – how many women went to the tomb, what their names were, was there one angel near the tomb or two, were they sitting on the stone, sitting in the tomb, or standing near it?

They really don't matter, these little differences, but they are fun to ponder - why the writer recollected things as they did. Don't be perturbed by these apparent contradictions, they are anything but. Let me explain. A few years back I was teaching a confirmation class about the stories of Jesus and we were discussing how each gospel was distinct. But they all tell the same story – the life of Jesus Christ of Nazareth. Then I casually (not!) asked anyone if they went to the local high basketball game the night before. Several had. I innocently (not!) asked what the final score was, who the leading scorers



were, who was ahead at halftime, if anyone fouled out, how the game ended, how many people attended, etc. I kid you not, it was obvious from the responses some kids attended a basketball game, but that was about where the similarity of the versions of the game ended. They got the point. The message they all agreed upon was "our team won." That was all that mattered.

Sometimes, when I visit with families after the death of a loved one, I will ask them "tell me something about your (mom, dad, wife, son)." Different people remember different things. They don't necessarily dispute what one says. They might suggest a correction or offer a clarification but the essential story or characteristic of their loved one no one really disputes. And they needed one another's prompting to remember it all. So too with our sacred story, we needed, in the wisdom of God that is, several "witnesses" to tell what they remembered, and we now need one another, the church, to listen to that story and pass on what we hear and believe and what it has done for us.

In Matthew, Mark and Luke, one of the little details that sticks out to me are the words of the angels, variously stated as "this is my message" or "just as he told you." Every single one of us has events or people in our lives that we will remember forever. Some are just plain hard to remember, the loved one we've lost, the tragic event we endured, the times when God may have felt distant to us. I have such moments just as you do. I am glad that the foundation of our faith as Christians then is the very same God of whom it is said, "in Christ Jesus, the answer to all his promises is "YES." God does what he has said he will do. What Matthew, Mark and Luke all agree upon is this — Christ is alive; Jesus will 'go ahead of you' into whatever the future may bring; and in those times and events "you will see him - just as he told you".

#### "Season of Easter"

Easter for Christians is not just one day, but rather a 50-day period. The season of Easter, or Eastertide, begins at sunset on the eve of Easter and ends on Pentecost, the day we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church (see Acts 2).

Easter is also more than just an extended celebration of the resurrection of Jesus. This extended season gives us time to rejoice and experience what it means when we say Christ is risen. It's the season when we remember our baptisms and how through this sacrament we are, according to the liturgy, "incorporated into Christ's mighty acts of salvation." As "Easter people," we also celebrate and ponder the birth of the Church and gifts of the Spirit (Pentecost), and how we are to live as faithful disciples of Christ.








#### From Booklist:
