My friend Harry Wendt of Crossways Ministries once said, paraphrasing an old Jewish proverb, "Tell me and I will forget, show me and I will remember, involve me and I will understand...and be changed"! The emphasis of our Confirmation ministry, and eventually all of our education ministries here at Calvary, will be directed toward accomplishing the goal of "involvement" in being a disciple of Jesus Christ – doing what NALC consultant Gary Pecuch calls "creating webs of faith" for every member of the congregation. This is especially important to our young members who have activities galore in their lives, access to 24/7 information and growing networks of friends and contacts. But, as experts tell us, they are some of the most anxious, and at times, loneliest people of our population.

I share a story that I read several years ago from Debbie Streicher who is National Director of 'Generations In Faith Together' (GIFT) Intergenerational Ministry :

> "I spent two unplanned weeks at my father's bedside last month. Nine out of ten doctors told us, "Your father has a totally blocked carotid artery on the left side. He does not have enough blood to his brain." We were told he wouldn't live alone again.

#### Pastor's Pen (continued)

After a week in the Intensive Care Unit, he was transferred to another floor. One day a doctor appeared at the foot of my father's bed and said he thought there was a real possibility that there was some activity and blood flow in the artery after reviewing the MRI results. He was right! Two days later, my father had surgery to clear the blockage. He is now living independently, driving, and enjoying his normal activities.

I couldn't help but compare thoughts about my father's blockage to apparent blockage in our congregations. I began to envision steps we could take to open the blockage and let the "blood flow". The fact is a person is more likely to develop blocked arteries as he or she ages. The fact is our congregations are aging! Nine out of ten congregations I visit express concern about our aging population. Can we be the one out of ten with the solution? If we do not intentionally invite children of all ages through our programs and fellowship, are we blocking the way? How many programs in our congregations invite the child? How many invite the adult? How many involve them simultaneously?

When the artery becomes blocked, it's called arterial disease. If one has total blockage, there is no procedure to clear it. If there is a trickle or some flow, there is hope. Perhaps we should take heed: "Your children who follow you in later generations ...will see the calamities that have fallen on the land—nothing planted, nothing sprouting, no vegetation growing on it." Deuteronomy 29:22-23.

Blockage builds up over the years. If not removed a stroke is inevitable. It's a matter of time. When removed, a healthy flow of blood is fed back to the brain, all types of emotions pour through that had been forgotten such as joy, laughter, memory, and a feeling of elation. A child's strength is the imagination. It's one of the biggest untapped resources we have in our congregations. We are all children of God. Maybe it's a matter of opening our imaginations. A healthy flow of imagination can contribute to a feeling of joy and elation. Where is the child welcome in our congregations? Is there a structure in place allowing a child to freely interpret scripture through the arts? Are joy and elation the norm when all the ages gather?

I ask you to please pray for our Megan Schatz as she affirms her faith on May 19th. Please continue to pray for Josh Morris and Sam Sayas (this year's 6th grade students) and Scott Anderson, Preston Meyer, and Jacklyn Warber (this year's 7th grade students). Pray that they will be part of renewal of our ministries to all ages. They are wonderful young people. Their prayer partners this year have been Annie Bermel, Bonnie Johnson, Kay Marshall, Audrey McGarvie, Judy Sayas and Barb Snyder They have given these youth their very best and we should be thankful and proud of them.

Kyle Jones, our Youth and Family Ministry Director, has created a wonderful new K-12 plan for faith formation in our congregation that will be refined and implemented next fall. It will be a new way of doing ministry with young people. But it's only a start. It will take time to fully integrate this philosophy into all of our ministries. But we will keep this in the forefront of all that we do.
