



# Christmas & Holiday Sing-Along Sunday, December 4, at 4 p.m.









# Women's Ministry Book Group - November 14, 2016



All Calvary women and their friends will get together at 1:00 pm on Monday, November 14 to discuss this month's selection, <u>When Books Went to War</u> by Molly Guptill Manning.

While this book discussion is part of the women's ministry programming at Calvary, **we invite any and all men of Calvary and their friends** to join us in reading and then discussing this fascinating piece of history!

"When America entered World War II in 1941, we faced an enemy that had banned and burned 100 million books. Outraged librarians launched a campaign to send free books to American troops and gathered 20 million hardcover donations. In 1943, the War Department and the publishing industry stepped in with an extraordinary program: 120 million small, lightweight paperbacks for troops to carry in their pockets and rucksacks in every theater of war. These Armed Services Editions were beloved by the troops and are still fondly remembered today. Soldiers read them while waiting to land at Normandy, in hellish trenches in the midst of battles in the Pacific, in field hospitals, and on long bombing flights. They helped rescue *The Great Gatsby* from obscurity and made Betty Smith, author of *A Tree Grows in* 

*Brooklyn,* into a national icon. *When Books Went to War* is the inspiring story of the Armed Services Editions, and a treasure for history buffs and book lovers alike."

[There are 15 copies of this book in the Waukesha County Library System (Bridges) and 15 copies in the Milwaukee County Library System (County Cat). Please make your personal request to borrow the book through the library system where you live.]

# **November Mission of the Month:**

Mosaic is a faith-based organization serving people with intellectual disabilities. They believe that every individual is a person of worth. Together Mosaic staff members, volunteers and the people we support work as partners. We are passionate about opportunities and

partnerships that create meaningful lives, in caring communities, giving a voice to the needs of the people we serve.

Mosaic was formed in 2003 with the merging of Bethpage (founded in Axtell, Neb. In 1913) and Martin Luther Homes (founded in Sterling, Neb. In 1925). Both groups mission was to serve children and adults with disabilities and served locations across the United States. One of the founders of Martin Luther Homes, Pastor Hoeger, stated "We are sisters and brothers in this work. If the angels are glad to serve us and human beings, then how much more should we be thankful and happy that we can also help others who need our help."

> Rev. Ted and Marion Youngquist first introduced Bethpage to Calvary when Pastor Youngquist was an Interim Pastor some 25+ years ago. Ted and Marion were students at Midland College in Fremont, Neb. In the 1940's when they first encountered Bethpage. Pastor Ted and Marion have generously supported Bethpage and now Mosaic ever since. In his retirement, Pastor Ted delighted in telling the Mosaic story and our Mission and Outreach Committee is proud to keep telling Ted's story and his commitment to organizations like Mosaic.
