Dear Members of Calvary Church.

I cite this passage from the Old Testament as I write to you about the church – odd perhaps since we think of the church as a product of the New Testament. The church is indeed the new creation of God, built upon the resurrection of Jesus and the witness of his first followers, but the church can properly trace its origins back to the Israel of the Old Testament. I commend to you the reading of the entire story from which this passage comes – II Kings 6:8-23. In a nutshell, the King of the Aram - Israel's enemy was perplexed that every time he went to make war on a town of Israel, the people were prepared and fortified. Convinced of a spy in his ranks, he inquired and learned that Israel's Prophet Elisha was able to discern from the Lord which towns were to be attacked by the Arameans and he told them to make ready.

So the King of Aram sent men to seize Elisha one day. But when they arrived where he was, he prayed and the Lord sent horses and chariots of fire to the surrounding hills to get the attention of the Aramean army and then struck them with blindness. Helpless, Elisha led them to Israel's king, who wondered if he should just do away with the soldiers. But Elisha said no, prepare for them a banquet. Israel's king did, God opened their eyes again, and the soldiers returned home and thereafter Aram never made war on Israel again!

I tell you this because Marcella and I recently attended the annual Convocation of the North American Lutheran Church. It was attended by over 650 delegates and guests from around the world. We heard reports of the growth, albeit modest, of our roughly 6 year old denomination, but growth nonetheless. In 2012 we had 330 congregations and 125,000 members and now we count 421 congregations and 141,500 members. We are not a large church body, but we are a growing one!

I could continue to give you statistics, such as the increase in subscription. the number of young students seeking ordination in our devotions – appropriate for families of most any configuration, denomination, or the new and solidly Biblical resources for go congregation and personal use being produced by "SOLA" - the www.holyfamilytime.com. New Resources Available

The first resource, Graying in Grace: Becoming Mature Disciples of Jesus Christ, is written by Pr. Brad Hales, who serves Reformation Lutheran church in Culpeper, VA. In 2009, Reformation was given the "Best Practices Award in Senior Ministry" by the National Council on Aging. He writes that the focus of the Bible study is: Assisting older adults in clinging to the faithful promises of God, and 'walking alongside' those who want to grow into 'mature disciples.' Because as we grow into the discipleship of Jesus Christ, we will have several opportunities to disciple others."

The second new resource, The Story of Our North American Lutheran Church, is written by Dr. Robert Benne. He initially wrote this short history for his home congregation to help its members understand why their congregation left the ELCA. He provides a concise history of Lutheran Churches in North America, including the formation of the ELCA, LCMC, and the NALC. He also presents a concise analysis of the divisions within the ELCA that led to congregations and individuals withdrawing from the ELCA.






What's Happening - -Walk to End Alzheimer's - Saturday, September 9, 2017
