## **Communion**

All those who are baptized and believe that Christ is present in this meal are welcome to receive communion with us.

When directed by an Usher, please come forward using the center aisle and kneel or stand at the altar rail. You will receive the bread then the wine. Grape juice & gluten free wafers are available upon request. Children who do not yet commune receive a blessing. Once you have been served, please return to your pew by the side aisles. If you are unable to come forward but wish to receive communion, let an Usher know and communion will be brought to you.

### **MISSION OF THE MONTH - NALC DISASTER RELIEF AND LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF**

The **NALC DISASTER RESPONSE FUND** provides resources for rapid response when domestic natural disasters occur, alleviates human suffering, provides transitional assistance and enables those affected to begin the rebuilding process. The NALC's Disaster Response Coordinator administers the use of the Fund, working cooperatively with and through local NALC congregations and members, as well as other compatible disaster relief organizations such as LCMS Disaster Response.

**LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF (LWR)** works with 100 local partners to improve harvests, health and education in 35 countries each year. These LWR partners train local women and men to produce local foods, dig low-cost wells and protect and restore their local environments. Some partners are small village groups on the edge of the Sahara. Others are nationwide programs that may reach across the Andes.

That week is open to all age campers kindergarten through high school.
