## Calvary's Vision and Beyond

Building on the two goals developed by the Evangelism Committee and adopted for the congregation at large, the Congregation Council developed a new vision statement for Calvary at their "Day of Renewal" on March 22nd. The new vision for Calvary is as follows: *Sharing the life-changing message of Jesus Christ.*

Simple and to the point, this vision is based on Jesus' Great Commission (found in Matthew 28) to his disciples and to all of us today! As Calvary members move forward in our endeavors – armed with the Gospel of Jesus Christ – we can do so with confidence in the steadfastness of our Lord, with eagerness to share His live-giving and life-changing news, and with the humbleness that comes from knowing that we, too, are in need of His grace and mercy.

At this time, individual committees are developing strategies for how they can do the work entrusted to them through a "lens of evangelism". That is, committees plan events, servicing opportunities, and more with the understanding that everything done should further the Vision. By doing so we continually share the Gospel of Jesus Christ which will, ultimately, grow His church here on earth.

But what can I, as an individual member, do to further the Vision? The opportunities are limitless! A good start is to be involved in learning more yourself. There are numerous opportunities at Calvary to

aid in this: Bible studies, Sunday Christian Education, small groups, Women's and Men's Ministry gatherings, youth groups, Daily Bible reading plans, and more. Find one that works for you and get into the Word!

Another way is to invite! Bring a friend, neighbor, relative or co-worker to worship with you. The evangelism committee provides resources throughout the year to assist you in inviting others to worship. If you don't feel ready to invite someone to worship, bring them to an event outside of worship as a start.

A third way - probably the "scariest" for many of us - is to talk about your faith with others. Step outside of your comfort zone and ask someone if they know Jesus. Or if they attend a church. Or maybe just start with "How are you?" Oftentimes when someone is hurting or going through a difficult time, that is the perfect opportunity to offer the life-changing message of Jesus. In the words of a well-known and favorite Easter hymn: "I know that my Redeemer lives! What comfort this sweet sentence gives!"

Finally, one of the easiest things to do is pray. Pray for the lost, pray for the church and those who minister & serve in the church, and pray for yourself. God bless each of you and we move forward together, sharing the life-changing message of Jesus Christ!

Dear Friends,

For those who follow major league baseball, opening day is fast approaching. Fans of every team are looking forward to the prospect of their club winning the pennant, or perhaps even the World Series. This anticipated event in the life of our nation reoccurs every single year, and yet for most of us, it never seems to lose its magic.

Easter is also that way. For more than 2,000 years, the Church has gathered on Easter morning to celebrate our Lord Jesus' Resurrection from the dead. We know what happened, and nothing is going to change that – and yet, there is an excitement and anticipation that befalls the Church every year in our preparations for this joyous celebration. Perhaps some of the excitement and anticipation is fueled by our desire that through our Easter celebrations, God will renew us personally. Perhaps at the conclusion of a long winter season, we are found longing for God to lift us out of the everyday experience of this life – with the numbness that it can produce – and transform us with joyful hearts and spirit-filled lives. Is it unrealistic for us to think this way? Are we being foolish and fanciful? Or is this kind of thinking, in fact, quite logical?

On that first Good Friday, Joseph and Nicodemus took a life-less dead Jesus, wrapped him in a linen cloth, and laid him in a grave. Jesus was dead. With the exception of a beautiful act of devotion on the part of the women who planned to anoint Jesus' remains – things had reached their end. When God raised Jesus from the dead, his body which had been dead came back



out of the grave alive. What's more – he was raised to never die again, and the same is promised to those who are baptized and believe in him. Paul writes in Romans, chapter 6: "Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his." (Romans 6:3-5).

If God promises to us such a great thing, is it too large a thing to expect that God will renew us now by His Holy Spirit? This Easter, we will again be confronted by the power of God working on our behalf. As we see the dead man Jesus hanging upon the Cross on Good Friday – we see God who is for us, taking away our sins by dying for them. When we peer into the barren tomb – we see God who is for us, giving us the promise of eternal life by raising Jesus bodily from the dead. As we gather to celebrate and worship our Lord Jesus, who was crucified for our sins and raised for our justification (Romans 4:25), may God renew your spirit, enliven your joy, and fill you with undaunted hope!

## Cal's Committee Corner: Christian Education

The Committee on Christian Education has special responsibility to provide a Christian education program designed to plant, nurture, and deepen a lifelong faith in Jesus Christ as Lord, and shall report thereon to the Congregation Council.

The Committee carries out objectives and policies set forth by the Pastoral leadership of the church, and coordinates the Christian Education program which includes Adult Education (Sunday Adult Education Hour, Women's Ministry, Men's Ministry, Small Groups), Library & Media Resources (Sunday School, First Steps, Pre-K to 5<sup>th</sup>, Confirmation, High

School), and Milestones (Cradle Roll, First Communion, First Bibles), Special Events (Good Friday, Christmas Pageant, Retreat, Adult Enrichment Opportunities).

The Christian Education Committee enlists and provides necessary resources to teachers and leaders. They also prepare annually a budget proposal for the activities of the committee and submit to the Budget and Finance Committee as well as oversee the appropriation and verification of budget funds.

The Christian Education Committee consists of at least 5 members, with at

least one Sunday School instructor, the Council Liaison, at least one parent with school age child(ren) in the Sunday School program(s), at least one adult representing the Adult Education programs, and a dedicated Christian Education Director.

Current members of the Christian Education Committee are Angie Schatz, Mary Ellen Thiede, Lynette Anderson, Jay Citraro, Marianne Citraro, and Jim Kalupa (Council Liaison).

We ask for your prayer support for this committee as they do the important work of "discipling" within Calvary.

## Easter Breakfast



We will once again host a Potluck Continental Easter breakfast between worship services! Doing it "potluck style" allow everyone the opportunity to enjoy the breakfast and -*most importantly* - worship on Easter morning.

### What does this mean?

7. You may bring your own serving utensils (please label and take them home with you immediately following the breakfast) or use the church utensils (these can be put into the dishwasher.)
8. We will have just a couple of "helpers" (sign up to help!) to get everything set up and decorated prior to Sunday. Additional helpers will have coffee made and juice & milk out, and will dispose of any leftover serving dishes at the end as well as any minor tidying that is necessary. (Please take your non-disposables home with you or make arrangements for someone else to take them.)
