Sue Rowe and Terry Trotier from the Board of Deacons; Jim Kalupa, Chuck Lukasik and Andy Schatz from Church Council; Elise Baumgartner, Megan Sayas and Sue Vollmar from the congregation atlarge. At our first meeting, the committee elected Andy Schatz to serve as Committee Chairperson and Sue Vollmar to serve as Committee Secretary.

Over the coming weeks the Committee will be having a conference call with Pastor David Wendell of the NALC to discuss and review the NALC call process. Following the conversation with Pastor Wendell the Committee will provide an overview of the call process to the Congregation and plans on providing



regular updates on how we are proceeding through the call process.

As we enter this time of transition for Calvary, prayer will be an essential part of the call process. Accordingly we ask that you Pray for God's guidance and support and that the Holy Spirit is working in the heart of the pastor He wishes to call as the next Pastor of Calvary.

### How Good Lord to be Here!!!

#### Greetings!

On Saturday, August 15, I will become your Interim Pastor. I am delighted and humbled to have accepted this role, this ministry among you. I am filled with joy when I think about sharing with you the gifts of worship, teaching, telling the story, and administering the Sacraments.

I am married to Dennis and we have 3 grown children, Phillip, Amilyn (& Rob), and Emily (& Zach); and 4 grandchildren, Maddie, John, Kevin, Kenny, and we live in Janesville, WI. I was born and raised in La Crosse, WI and Dennis is from Brodhead, WI. ### **Annual Collection for Lutheran World Relief** submitted by RoJean Holler

School Kits: Include the following items in each School Kit:

- Four 70-sheet notebooks (280-300 sheets total) of wide- or college
  One light-weight bath-size towel (20" X 40" to 52" X 27"), dark -ruled paper approximately 8" X 101/2"; no loose-leaf paper
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- One pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- Five black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- One box of 16 or 24 crayons
- One 21/2" eraser

A group of Calvary members are sewing the backpacks. Just bring in the supplies for each school kit and they will be put into a backpack. If you sew and would like to make a few bags, please contact Jane Krause or Judy DeBruine. We have a supply of fabric and rope.

Health Kits: Include the following items in each Personal Care Kit:

- color recommended
- Two bath-size bars (4 to 5 oz.) of soap, any brand, in original wrapping
- One adult-size toothbrush in its original packaging\* Calvary has a large supply of toothbrushes—you are welcome to take them for your kits
- One sturdy comb (no picks or fine-toothed combs); remove packaging
- One metal nail clippers (attached file optional); remove packaging

\*Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

#### All kits must be turned in by the end of September!

### AED: When Seconds Count

AED stands for Automatic External Defibrillator. An AED is a portable device that analyzes the heart's rhythm and determines if an electric shock is needed to restore an effective rhythm. AEDs, when used within the first 3-5 minutes of a person suffering a Sudden Cardiac Arrest (heart attack) can dramatically increase a victims chance of survival. AEDs were



designed to be used by virtually anyone with little or no experience.

The AED will automatically analyze the heart rhythm of a pulseless victim and, if needed, shock the

attempt to restore its rhythm to normal. AEDs will not shock patients who do not require a shock.

Fellowship Hall, near the kitchen. Please take a moment to visually locate it in the event that you may need to use it to help someone.

The AED at Calvary is fully automatic. Once opened and removed, an automated voice prompt begins and guides you through each step of the process. The AED will assess whether the person needs a shock and will only deliver a shock if it is determined to be necessary.

There is a training DVD available in the church office for anyone wishing to know more in case of such an emergency. See victim's heart in an Holly if you would like to view the DVD at any time, although prior training is not required to be able to operate this particular device.

Calvary has an AED centrally located in our Our hope is that we never need to actually use the device, but we want everyone to know that it is available in case of emergency.

> We are blessed to be so close to the Brookfield Fire Department and to emergency medical assistance, and dialing 9-1-1 in an emergency is always a must. In the rare case that someone needs immediate help, and when seconds matter, it's important for members to know that we have an AED unit on the premises and to know its location.


