Holy Week & Easter 2016

Follow Jesus's Path through Holy Week and Easter Services at Calvary, March 20-27.

Palm Sunday: March 20

• Communion Worship, 9a (March 19, 5p)

Palm Sunday commemorates the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover. The gospels record the arrival of Jesus riding into the city on a donkey, while the crowds spread their cloaks and palm branches on the street and shouted their hosannas.

Maundy Thursday: March 24

• Communion Worship, 7p

Maundy Thursday (also known as Holy Thursday) commemorates the Last Supper that Jesus shared with his disciples on the night before he was crucified. It was during this time that Jesus instituted the sacrament of the Lord's Supper or Communion.

Good Friday: March 25

Good Friday Worship at 7p

Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus. It is the most solemn day in the Christian calendar and we observe this day with great humility and reverence.

Good Friday is a day of sorrow mingled with joy. It is a time to grieve over the sin of man and to meditate and rejoice upon God's love in giving His only Son for the redemption of sin. We call this day "Good" Friday because it is the day when Jesus paid for our

sins by dying in our place.

The Good Friday liturgy addresses the triumph of the Cross, for without the Cross there would have been no Resurrection. The service is in three parts: The Service of the Word, including the Passion according to St. John; the Bidding Prayer, a powerful series of prayers for mercy and deliverance; and the Adoration of the Cross, at which we celebrate the triumph of the Cross over evil and death.

Easter Sunday: March 27

Communion Worship, 9a (& March 26, 5p)

On Easter Sunday we celebrate Christ's resurrection form the dead and His victory over death and the grave. As the climax of Holy Week, Easter is a time of hope and assurance.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!

command. "And you are to love those who are foreigners [strangers], for you yourselves were foreigners in Egypt." (Deut. 10:19, see also Ex. 22:21, Ex. 23:9, Lev. 19:34) God created a people who would worship Him alone and serve others. In the midst of this life-mission, they would be a model to all those living in their midst as well as the surrounding nations.

It is the same for us this day. During our mid-week Lenten services (Wednesday – March 2, 9 and 16 at 7pm) we will look more closely on how we are to live out this same ideal in our day. How are we to be set apart to worship God only while being a light to others? Come and see! We might even see an example or two from our amazing drama team!!

I hope you'll join us on Wednesdays nights, on Saturday or Sunday and during Holy Week as we continue to study and pray, to worship and to sing to our Lord, God.

- 8. We will have just a couple of "helpers" (sign up to help!) to get everything set up and decorated prior to Sunday. Additional helpers will have coffee made and juice & milk out, and will dispose of any leftover serving dishes at the end as well as any minor tidying that is necessary. (Please take your non-disposables home with you or make arrangements for someone else to take them.)

New Life Lutheran Church, Menomonie

Calvary is partnered in support of New Life Lutheran Church in Menomonie, WI. During the month of March, our offerings to Mission of the Month go directly to this congregation.

New Life Lutheran is a growing congregation led by Pastor Roy Harrisville III. Grace Gunnlaugsson had a conversation with Pastor Harrisville recently in which he updated us on developments since last March. In August of 2015, the congregation moved from their temporary worship space in a school to a semipermanent location they are renting from Oak Ridge Lutheran Brethren Church in Menomonie. That congregation is half the size of New Life, and the sharing/rental has blessed both congregations. New Life has its own sanctuary space and classroom space, as does Oak Ridge. They share the church kitchen.

New Life worships at 9 am on Sundays

and then has Sunday School. Oak Ridge begins the morning with Sunday School and then worships at 10:30. This system seems to be working well so far.

In other news from New Life, through the generosity of two of their members, they now have a digital piano, and Pastor Harrisville was able to connect it to their audio system, so the congregation sings the praises of our Lord even more enthusiastically.


