



# Music Corner - Gene Traas



This article consists of three sections:

1. a calendar revision

2. a talk on hymnody

3. and a call for handbell players.

1. The sign-out calendar for Alleluia Choir and Celebration Ringers has a disclaimer that states that all dates are in flux until further notice. Last month I listed three dates for Summer Choir, which are now changed thanks to the act of scheduling visits to New Jersey to tend to my mother. Summer Choir will meet on June 12<sup>th</sup>, July 17<sup>th</sup>, and August 14<sup>th</sup>, starting at 8:15am on each day.

2. When I was a student in the Greater Milwaukee Synod's diakonia program, the worship class had a final project of selecting hymns for a particular day (Pentecost, which is usually a no-brainer). Of the six students, four selected tunes based on the criteria known as "because I like them."

I select hymns based on the following order:

- a) Fitting the scriptures for the day;
- b) the season (Easter, Pentecost, etc.);

c) Favorites list, generated by a survey a few years ago;

d) if nothing else works, punt.

If you encounter unfamiliar melodies, that's because it's the only way I can determine what Calvary knows, and what Calvary doesn't know. I'm attempting to build a common hymn language – bear with me. One last item on this subject: There is no such thing as a "hymn selection dartboard." If there were, I wouldn't be using it unless desperate.

3. Two noted Ringers will be departing Calvary soon. I invite you, if you've ever felt an inclination to swing large metal objects under adult supervision that serve a better purpose than kettlebells, now is the time to join Celebration Ringers. Training classes will be held during the summer – more on this later.


