Pastor Ken's Pondering

"You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it."

John 14:14

I have to admit, this verse has often perplexed me. In my journal today, meditating on these words, which will form the basis of my sermon this weekend, I wrote "Lord, if you grant such requests, how do you determine what you will give - how do you determine who receives what?" I added that I was a bit timid - a better word might be afraid to ask for "anything" - sure as I am that I would ask for something I was not ready for, or which would place on me too great a burden if so gifted.

I said "would such praying require of me more faith, or more careful prayers. Must I repeat my requests often so as to demonstrate I really mean it - you know, show some conviction on my part." The key to this verse seems to be the phrase "in my name." In John 14;13 it says "I will do whatever you ask in my name so that the Son may bring glory to the Father." It isn't just a formula for starting or ending a prayer, though we all the time hear prayers that end "in your name we pray." Rather it seems to me it means "asking for the sort of things Jesus asked for."

That of course included both release from his own suffering in the Garden of Gethsemane to protecting his followers





the United States.

When a disaster occurs (such as the hurricanes of Texas and Florida, flooding in Nebraska and South Dakota, and most recently the tornadoes in Tennessee) the funds are used to:

- alleviate human suffering;
- provide transitional assistance; and
- enable those affected to begin the rebuilding process

In addition to funds the NALC Disaster Response team collects and distributes items that can be given out to disaster victims.

In the fall of 2018, a semi truck stopped at Calvary and we were able to send relief items to hurricane victims at that time.



site. The items will be delivered to the national warehouse in Caldwell, Ohio and distributed across the USA when disaster strikes.

We are collecting new or clean used blankets, quilts or bedding of any kind, sleeping bags, health kits, new or used adult and children's Bibles and school backpacks (see description below of items needed for school backpack kits). Why do they do this? For several reasons:



- Convenient don't need to remember to write a check. Can be established for recurring contributions. And, you can designate for general giving, Mission of the Month, etc.
- 2. Safe today's systems require secure systems. Calvary utilizes the services of VANCO, a highly rated payment processing company focused on non-profits.
- 3. Can use Credit Cards as a payment option.
- 4. Green less paper utilization, no checks & no envelopes needed.
- 5. Easy to do see the two methods below.

Method One — for payment from your checking or savings account.

Complete a Simply Giving document and include a voided check or savings deposit slip. The document can be obtained from the table in the Narthex or by calling the office. Once established, changes are easily made by calling Cindy Rooks in the office.

Method Two — for payment by credit card, checking or savings. You can access the Calvary Lutheran Church VANCO website through this <u>ONLINE GIVING LINK</u> or via the online giving link at the bottom of the church's website (www.calvarylc.com). Once on the VANCO site, you'll need to create an account and complete the information requested.
