Understanding Jesus' Parables Kyle Jones, Director of Faith Formation



The complexity of Jesus' parables makes them a challenge to understand. Other obstacles compound that complexity. In order to better grasp the parables, let's look at three of those obstacles.

Aftermarket Titles

Titles can be useful when discussing parables. As

we refer to them when talking about the Bible or theology, titles can function as a sort of shorthand. However, the traditional titles given to the parables also do us a disservice. Instead of opening our minds to understanding Jesus' words, they restrict our understanding by directing our focus to a singular aspect of the parable before we've even read it.

"The Parable of the Sower" is a chief example. This parable stands out because each Gospel that records it (Matthew, Mark, and Luke) also reports Jesus' explanation of it. In his explanation, Jesus says little about the sower. So to call it "The Parable of the Sower" sends us in the wrong direction. Sometimes this parable is referred to as "The Parable of the Four Soils." But even that title falls short, because it focuses on the soil, whereas Jesus emphasizes the seed, which represents God's Word.

Jesus never titled the parables. They were added later. They are not divinely inspired Scripture. Therefore, we can freely disregard them. This allows us to come to the parables of Jesus with minds as open as possible, and (hopefully) with fewer assumptions as to their meaning and purpose.

Surrounding Context

One way to combat misrepresentative titles is to recognize the context in which Jesus tells them. He didn't deliver them randomly. Rather, Jesus told them to suit the occasion.

For instance, Jesus told the story of "The Pharisee and the Tax Collector" "to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and treated others with contempt" (Luke 18:9). The context, however, doesn't put the actions of the Pharisee and tax collector at the heart of the story. The key question is where righteousness and unrighteousness come from.

The parable of "The Good Samaritan" comes in the context of a salvation question: "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" (Luke 10:25). Whereas this parable is

Sharing Your Faith ... A "How To" Series

The Share Jesus Questions

It has been said that it takes an average of 7.6 times for someone to hear the gospel before they receive it. How do we know the number of times the person has heard the message? We don't, that's why we have to ask non-threatening probing questions to determine where they are at spiritually. We must listen attentively and you may be able to determine if they are dealing with problems like loneliness, emptiness, pain, or anger.



You will be able to discern how close their heart is to God. The five "Share Jesus Questions" you can ask are as follows:

- Do you have any kind of spiritual beliefs? Don't ask "Do you believe in God?" because that is often considered offensive. If they respond or not, just ask the next question.
- 2. To you, who is Jesus Christ? This question separates religious people from relational people. You would hope for an answer that says "He is my Lord and Savior"
- 3. Do you believe in heaven or hell? Wait for a response

and ask the next question.

- 4. If you died, where would you go? Many might say "Heaven, of course." You might ask "Why would God let you in?" That brings us to the last question to help you get where you want to go. That will give you permission to open your Bible or share scripture.
- 5. If what you are believing is not true, would you want to know? There are only two possible answers: yes or no. If yes, go on to the next phase. If no, they often say, "Well, aren't you going to tell me?" There are some well known scripture passages you can show them. More on that in next month's article.

You can use these questions as needed. You will be amazed at how open most people are. Just remember your motive for evangelism must be your love for God and love for people. Pray daily for God to put people in your path. As you look around each week ask, "Father, where are you working? Where can I join you?"

You may be feeling that you are afraid to share your faith...and that is OK. The apostle Paul went to share his faith with much fear, weakness, and trembling. But still he went. It will get easier each time you do it. If some people are not open to talking about these matters do nothing. But remember you have not failed. You have been obedient to share the gospel, and the results belong to God. Have fun!

Social distancing has been established in the Sanctuary with assigned pews for each service, designated by colored tags (see photo). Please sit only in the pew with the tag designated for that service. If you are not sitting with your family, please observe the 6' distance between you and someone next to you (approximately two arm lengths).

All high touch points such as pews and door handles are sanitized after each service. The



Altar Guild follows strict sanitation practices when filling the cups. We are using hosts instead of bread and wine is "self serve". All servers are wearing masks and will wash their hands in the Sacristy prior to serving communion.

Mission of the Month

Hope Street Ministry

Hope Street Ministry helps broken men, women and children cultivate hope, and provides protection from the outside elements and most importantly supports growth together in a relationship with Jesus Christ.

Hope Street Ministry is home to about 40 men, women and children whose lives have been profoundly affected by the toxic environment they grew up in, their own poor choices, or drug and alcohol abuse.

Empowered by the active Grace of Christ, the staff, volunteers, and members create a nurturing community for people to live, learn and develop new habits to flourish.

The organizational roots were developing in the 1990's. By 2000, Hope Street opened its doors at 26th and Capital. In their 20 years, they have developed a place for transformational heart-changing, as well as behavioral modification.

In 2014 they received approval to allow children to live with parents for the healing and learning of healthy family practices. In 2015 generous donations allowed for the basement of the building to include more healthy living areas, including a workout facility, a Bible study room a computer lab, an adult community room, a kid's playroom, a teen room and a laundry facility. Hope Street takes price in creating apartments and communal spaces that anyone would be proud to live in -- where environment uplifts dignity, and members learn to cherish and be cherished. A Refuge Garden was created in 2019. and the building of



Shechem (a community center) is forthcoming. Successful members move on to work and independent living with healthy life skills, and a continued connection to their community. Our gifts this month support the work and expansion of offerings Hope Street Ministry provides to members and as a beacon in the community.

This is an uplifting organization moving forward under the direction of Ashley Thomas, Executive Directory, who will be with us at worship this weekend to share more information.
