This Week's Pondering Ken Nelson, Senior Pastor



"The servants asked Him, do you want us to go and pull them up?" "No", he answered, because while you are pulling up the weeds, you may root up the wheat with them. Let them both grow until the harvest." Matthew 13:28-30a

Ok, time for an admission – I'm a "grass guy" whereas my wife is the "flower lady" of our household. Some would say I'm "OCD" on this issue of turf grass - (my wife, kids, and any observant neighbor I've had in the last 30 years would all nod) – I like Kentucky blue or rye grass and if see a dandelion in my yard, even from the supper table, I've been known to spring into action, either giving the offending weed a generous spray of something toxic or pulling my fool head off till I get it – root and all – which as most of you know is all but impossible. I once had an outbreak of "Creeping Charlie" in a lawn and probably didn't sleep well for weeks – I'd be out till sunset (and beyond) trying to follow the root system of those things through my precious grass. Good luck with that I found.

My wife pretty much leaves me to my own devices on the lawn. But her countenance changes if on the edge of her flower garden she notices me spying something I suspect is a weed and start to plan my attack. She knows to her considerable chagrin I've taken up not a few budding flowers I was certain couldn't possibly be anything but a weed! In the parables of our Lord, readers tend to gravitate to certain characters/metaphors more than others. We'd all love to see ourselves as the good soil, or the good seed, or the Good Samaritan.

The parable of the "weeds and the wheat" in Matthew 13 however leaves me utterly defenseless. I'm the fixated servant offended at the presence of something "weedish" in the field of God's kingdom - skeptical, even exasperated, that the Lord would let a weed (in fact many of them) grow alongside wheat and not "nip them in the bud."

Hello! I want you to know I'm very honored to have been chosen and entrusted with the music ministry here at Calvary. I appreciate your graciousness in welcoming me and it's been a real blessing to meet and talk with many of you. I look forward to meeting more as, at some point, things return to "normal." Of course, I'm also enjoying getting to know your splendid organ!

Right now, because of COVID-19, it's looking as if we won't be able to have "normal" choir in September, but I am doing some research on virtual choir, which you may have seen or heard online. In a nutshell, each person is emailed the sheet music and given a link to videorecord his or her own part; once each member has recorded a clean take, I can put those tracks together and blend them to create a choir sound. We can play back this finished product in our worship service, keeping everyone safe as long as we need to.

It's not like "real" choir but it's an option. It also has the advantage of being on your schedule; you won't have to drop everything to rehearse at Calvary at a certain time. 
Video Equipment Fundraiser with 50% Match

We have taken many steps to ensure as safe of an environment as possible – please use your own judgement in choosing to come. You must do what is most comfortable for you. We will also continue to offer the weekend worship materials via email, as well as delivery of home communion to any

member who wishes to receive it. Please call the office at 262.786.4010 for more details or to sign up to receive home communion.

Safe practices are in place for all worship services.

Face masks are strongly encouraged while at worship. We will have a limited supply on hand near the entrance to the Sanctuary.

Social distancing has been established in the Sanctuary with assigned pews for each service, designated by colored tags (see photo). Please sit only



in the pew with the tag designated for that service. If you are not sitting with your family, please observe the 6' distance between you and someone next to you (approximately two arm lengths).

All high touch points such as pews and door handles are sanitized after each service. The Altar Guild follows strict sanitation practices when filling the cups. We are using hosts instead of bread and wine is "self serve". All servers are wearing masks and will wash their hands in the Sacristy prior to serving communion.

Hope Street Ministry

Hope Street Ministry helps broken men, women and children cultivate hope, and provides protection from the outside elements and most importantly supports growth together in a relationship with Jesus Christ.

Hope Street takes price in creating apartments and communal spaces that anyone would be proud to live in -- where environment

Hope Street Ministry is home to about 40 men, women and children whose lives have been profoundly affected by the toxic environment they grew up in, their own poor choices, or drug and alcohol abuse.

Empowered by the active Grace of Christ, the staff, volunteers, and members create a nurturing community for people to live, learn and develop new habits to flourish.

The organizational roots were developing in the 1990's. By 2000, Hope Street opened its doors at 26th and Capital. In their 20 years, they have developed a place for transformational heart-changing, as well as behavioral modification.

In 2014 they received approval to allow children to live with parents for the healing and learning of healthy family practices. In 2015 generous donations allowed for the basement of the building to include more healthy living areas, including a workout facility, a Bible study room a computer lab, an adult community room, a kid's playroom, a teen room and a laundry facility.

uplifts dignity, and members learn to cherish and be cherished. A Refuge Garden was created in 2019, and the building of Shechem (a community center) is forthcoming. Successful members move on to work and independent living with healthy life skills, and a

continued connection to their community. Our gifts this month support the work and expansion of offerings Hope Street Ministry provides to members and as a beacon in the community.
