What's the Purpose of a Worship Service?

Whether online or in-person, what's the purpose of participating in a worship service? For many, the answer might be, "Because it's the right thing to do." For others, the answer could be, "Well, that's what we've always done on Sundays." Still, others might answer, "To glorify God."

While some of these answers have kept some people participating in and attending worship, decades of dwindling church attendance show that these are not sustainable reasons to regularly participate in a church worship service. So let's look at three good reasons Scripture gives us.

The **first** reason is to meet with the creator of all things in a sure and knowable way. How can we be sure God is there? He promises to be.

He is there most assuredly in his word and sacrament. That word which is synonymous with his presence is his name. We worship in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit because as Jesus says, "where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them" (Matt 18:20).

While we meet with the creator of all things to offer praise and thanksgiving and to pray for others, we don't do those things to bring God down or to serve him in some way. The worship service is less like servants entering the throne room to wait on the needs of the king and more like a father joining his family around the dining room table. He ...

WEEKEND WORSHIP SCHEDULE

Saturday at 5:00 p.m. Sunday at 8:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m.

We have taken many steps to ensure as safe of an environment as possible – please use your own judgement in choosing to come. You must do what is most comfortable for you. Face masks are required while at worship. Social distancing has been established

in the Sanctuary with assigned pews for each service, designated by colored tags (see photo). Please sit only in the pew with the tag designated for that service. If you are not sitting with your family, please observe the 6' distance between you and someone next to you (approximately two arm lengths).

All high touch points such as pews and door handles are sanitized after each service. The Altar Guild follows strict sanitation practices when filling the cups. We are using hosts instead of bread and wine is "self serve". All servers will wash their hands in the Sacristy prior to serving communion.

The group supports over 15 city ministries such as local partnerships, in-prison and re-entry ministries, community outreach events, recovery programs, youth activities and many others.

It is a well-established and highly regarded organization that's been in existence for over 20 years. It seeks to strengthen the evangelical outreach and growth of local churches, as well as help alleviate poverty and other difficult social problems. By fostering cooperation and teamwork while also connecting with resources, B.A.S.I.C.S. makes each outreach effort more effective.

The Calvary mission of the month donations for September will be supporting two ministries under the B.A.S.I.C.S. umbrella. Bibles written at a third grade reading level, along with blankets to provide comfort and warmth, are distributed to individuals in impoverished areas throughout Milwaukee. Personal Care Kit Collection

Cleanliness may not actually be next to godliness, but it certainly helps a person feel more human. When families find their homes destroyed, or must flee for their safety, soap and a towel rarely make the cut for what they can carry. The simple items included in a Personal Care Kit provide much-needed self-care, critical germ fighting, and the chance to regain dignity amidst situations of fear and uncertainty

Items to be included in the kit are:

-One light weight bath size towel, dark color recommended

-Two or three bath size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz. in original wrapping

-One adult size toothbrush in its original packaging (or an individual toothbrush in a business size envelope)

-One sturdy comb, remove packaging



-One metal nail clipper, remove packaging
