Matthew 22:21

I've not had the chance to listen to much of the confirmation hearings currently underway in the United States Senate for a new Supreme Court Justice – but from what I am told the appointee, Judge Barrett is handling a lot of difficult questions with skill. Still, lots of folks seem to be accusing her of avoiding the issues raised – of giving evasive answers.

That's the nature of these confirmation hearings I've discovered over the years. Judges who are supposed to be impartial are nonetheless asked how they'd rule on a case and the very nature of being a judge means you don't indicate how you'd rule before you have the case before you. So, no matter if the nominee is considered liberal or conservative, their answers tend to all be quite ...well ... vague.

Our Lord Jesus shall not be accused, in these pages at least, of avoiding a topic or being vague. But in an interrogation by certain legal experts of the Jews, men who were called "Pharisees", I think we might conclude that Jesus gave a clever answer. Asked if he, a citizen of Israel, thought it was okay (to the Pharisees this meant "legal") to pay taxes to Caesar – the king of another country, Jesus said ... well, you tell me. He said give Caesar things that belong to Caesar. Since he was asked about




Pastor Ken's Wednesday Bible Study Resumes October 21 at 12:30pm
