"Praise the Lord

from the earth, you great sea creatures and all deeps, fire and hail, snow and mist, stormy wind fulfilling his word! Mountains and all hill, fruit trees and all cedars." Psalm 148: 9-10

Martin Luther wrote "Psalm 148 is a psalm of thanks that excites and exhorts all creatures in heaven and on earth to praise God. Rightfully all of creation should be nothing but a tongue, always praising the great goodness of God. If you want to know how good it is, then take whatever you will and say: 'if there were no sun ... if there were no snow and mist ... if there were no wind, and so on. Then you will see why one should thank God.""

Luther believed this Psalm "belonged" to the 1st Article of the Apostles Creed - "I believe in God, creator of heaven and earth." Luther often read the Psalms as exhortations to faith, or as commentary on the catechism in one way or another.

Today, I would simply ask you to look about. Drive or walk up and down any street and don't look at the houses, or the political signs or the toys or cars or swing set. Look at a tree. Contrast it to the lush green of the grass. Ask yourself how something could not, in this moment, be praising God it's creator more than a maple tree with seven hues of color adorning it all at once. Ask yourself ...

As a child growing up in North Korea, Hyeonseo Lee was one of millions trapped by a secretive and brutal communist regime. Her home on the border with China gave her some exposure to the world beyond the confines of the Hermit Kingdom and, as the famine of the 1990s struck, she began to wonder, question and to realize that she had been brainwashed her entire life. Given the repression, poverty and starvation she witnessed surely her country could not be, as she had been told "the best on the planet"?

Aged seventeen, she decided to escape North Korea. She could not have imagined that it would be twelve years before she was reunited with her family.
