This Week's Pondering Pastor Ken Nelson



"The Angel went to her and said, "Greetings you who are highly favored. The Lord is with you." Luke 1:28

In the Roman Catholic tradition, these words from the gospel of Luke are perhaps spoken more

than any others by their faithful members. They form the opening line of what the Church calls "the Hail Mary" – usually rendered "Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee" before continuing with "blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb Jesus." They are wonderful, poetic words worthy of being embraced by all Christians.

Yes, Mary was blessed, of that there can be little doubt. The Bible contains stories of many, many remarkable people. Among the most famous would be Moses followed likely by David, from the Old Testament – Peter and Paul from the New. Very much is written about them – the pages of Scripture dedicated to their lives and words far exceed those dedicated to Mary. Of this most unique woman, who did something no other human has or ever will do, remarkably little in fact is said. Her story is told in roughly 100 verses in the Bible. Moses' story spans at least four entire Old Testament books by comparison. We find Mary's actual words in less than 20 *verses*. Paul wrote 13 entire *books* of the New Testament.

By volume of material, Mary is quite a modest figure. Yet, is there any more well-known woman in all of history? I rather doubt it. What she did, of course, is ...





December Mission of the Month: Seminary Funds



In December we raise up a vital Mission of the Month supporting the training of pastors for service in the North American Lutheran Churches. We have been blessed to have Lynnae Douglas with us this year as a pastoral intern. Lynnae and her husband Caleb are both graduates of the North American Lutheran Seminary in Amhearst, Pennsylvania.

Why is this important? The NALC is growing and the need for pastors trained for our Synod is crucial to us and congregations like ours in the NALC. Current pastors in other Synod traditions have received training in preparation for serving in NALC congregations; however, many of those pastors are nearing retirement. The NALC has grown from 17 congregations at inception to over 440.

Initially there was only one seminary in Amhearst, PA; however, due to growth and demand, the Lutheran Institute of Technology in Brookings, SD also trains pastors for the NALC. We have a goal this year to increase our giving from \$5,000 to \$7,000.

Are you interested in attending seminary? Local congregations like Calvary are the source of future seminarians.
