This Week's Pondering

Pastor Ken Nelson, Senior Pastor



"Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." I Samuel 3:9b

I dare say, I would love to hear what the Lord has to say about our world. In a matter of minutes after waking each morning, my phone starts that little "bleep" sound telling me

all sorts of outlets want to say something to me. I know it's entirely up to me if I want to listen – the temptation to at least glance at the first few paragraphs of a newsfeed is real. Lots of folks have something to say these days, and I don't need to tell you not all of it is encouraging, not all of it is relevant, and of course not all of it is true.

This morning was no different. I awoke before the first sliver of pink was on the eastern horizon and there it was, faint but perceptible, that blasted "bleep..bleep..bleep" of stories vying for my attention. I like to stay as informed as any of us, but at times I feel like I'm being assaulted before I can even focus my eyes and rub the sleep out of them. Like little Samuel I wonder – "who is calling me?". This wonderful little story, which we'll hear in our services this weekend, describes the young boy Samuel (set apart at birth for service to the Lord, but too young to have had much formal training) who is awakened three times by a sound, which we're told is the Lord calling his name. Each time he assumes it can't be God, so he goes to his mentor the old priest Eli for explanation, assuming it was Eli who was calling him.

Finally, Eli, aged and apparently not amused that his precious sleep keeps getting interrupted, all but says "Go back to bed. If you hear the voice again say 'Speak Lord, for your servant is listening'" (and by implication, stop bothering me!) That is what Samuel does, and of course he hears God call him yet again. The message is not pleasant or easy to accept. It involves a sobering assessment of his mentor Eli and the judgement of God upon him and his household. We won't delve into that.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION - Annual Meeting 2020



Calvary's Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday, January 31 at 9:30 a.m. in the Sanctuary. (Note: There will NOT be Christian Education or a 10:15 a.m. service that day.)

Several important items will be voted on at that meeting specifically a ratification of amendments to the NALC Constitution. More information is provided below, along with a link to the specific documents to support the amendments.

An Informational Meeting will be held on January 24 at 9:15 a.m. in the Sanctuary. To be discussed at that informational session will be:

- 2020 Financial Results
- 2021 Budget
- Properties update
- NALC Ratification of Constitutional Amendments (see information below)

Copies of the Annual Report for 2020 can be picked up in the Narthex. A separate Committee Report that summarizes activities for 2020 is being compiled and will be available on January 31.

Calvary Lutheran Church needs to ratify NALC Constitutional Amendments approved at the 2020 Mission Convocation. A copy of the information regarding these amendments can be read <u>HERE</u>.

There are two general amendments impacting various sections of the NALC Constitution. These amendments DO NOT impact the Constitution or Bylaws of Calvary Lutheran Church. Approval by the Calvary congregation can be as one or two resolutions. We suggest one resolution as the amendments do not appear controversial.

- Determining the Lay Delegates at the Convocation currently this is a mathematical
 calculation based on the congregation's size. This has been challenging since the NALC
 congregations have a very different mix of sizes. The change would allow the Executive
 Council to determine the number based on current congregational and clergy
 membership.
- Change from an Annual Convocation to a Biennial Convocation. The main purpose of
 the amendments associated with this change is to address how the NALC, at all levels,
 deploys its resources to perform the mission of the Holy Spirit.

Nominating Committee Members Needed

Under our By-Laws, we need four members of the congregation for the 2021 Nominating Committee whose role is to identify three incoming Council members for 2022. If you are willing to serve on the Nominating Committee, you can reach out to Brad Meyer (Council President) or the church office. The tasks of this committee do not necessarily require in-person meetings and does not require a large time commitment.

I may be a little geeky (okay, a lot), but my idea of a fun family outing is bringing my kids on the annual "organ crawl" aka tour hosted by the local AGO chapter (American Guild of Organists).
Unfortunately, the event is cancelled again this year because of COVID, but I wanted to plant the seed for next year.

Don't be intimidated. No membership required to join the outing. Just contact your friendly local organist and ask. These informal, adventurous events are usually held in March, sometime between Lent and Easter. Your local chapter of the



AGO a will usually carry an announcement on its website. The tours are usually local, as in downtown Milwaukee, Kettle Moraine area, or as far away as Chicago or Watertown. You get to tour a number of beautiful worship spaces and enjoy a variety of different organ sounds. If you (or your child) play, bring along some sheet music; you just have to ask for a turn at the keyboard. The Saturday event usually lasts for some hours, while you visit 2-3 organs in the morning, break for lunch, and resume to visit a couple in the afternoon. You can stay as long as you like or break it off early (which I've had to do for the sake of the kids).

Another splendid event for children (in a non-COVID time) is an Orgelkids event, usually sponsored through AGO and administrated by your ambitious local music director. It's more of a STEM class than a musical event. The administrator rents a kit (something like 100 wooden pieces) from Orgelkids, and lets the kids (as a group) examine the pieces, divide into teams, and assemble a very simple wooden pipe organ, followed by playing the 12-note keyboard, (which is more enjoyable if the child has taken piano lessons.) If you'd like more information, feel free to visit orgelkidsusa.org Honestly, I'm eager to host or point you to such an event post-COVID, along with many other ideas.




Monday Morning Movie

- · Shelf stable almond or soy milk

A few reminders



The right side of the Sanctuary (as you face the altar) is equipped with a hearing loop system which transmits an audio signal directly into a hearing aid via a magnetic field. This greatly

reduces background noise, competing sounds, reverberation and other acoustic distortions that reduce clarity of sound.

Most hearing aids are equipped with a t-coil and connecting to this system is an easy switch on the hearing aid. If you need assistance during worship with this system, please reach out to an usher or any staff member.

The church office is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until noon. The door that is closest to the office (NW



corner) will be open during those hours.
