This Week's Pondering

"Then the word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time. Go to the great city of Nineveh and proclaim to it the message I give to you." Jonah 3:1-2

The Old Testament book of Jonah is best known as the story of a big fish and a really fortunate man. But at its most basic level Jonah is a

call story. At the risk of pre-empting my colleague and pastoral intern Lynnae, who is going to write in this space next week, I wanted to write about the process of call in our church. For those of you who tune in to our weekly podcast "Foretaste of the Feast", next Tuesday's edition will be devoted to reflections on the call to ministry. Lynnae's reflections both there and in her article next week will bring you much more detail about what lies ahead for her and her family in the coming months and years.

I want to thank Lynnae for her wonderful service to our congregation this past year. As she will explain, her twoyear half-time internship was accelerated to one year because of the February arrival of the Douglas' fourth child. So Lynnae "got busy' and we ramped up her work this fall and winter to assure she'd had a complete internship experience. January 31st is her last official day. Thank you for welcoming her and her family so warmly and entrusting her with many pastoral duties and personal conversations, enriching her experience immensely. But back to the question of call. Now it falls to Lynnae and Caleb to discern their next steps. Call is a gift of God but also a task from God. IMPORTANT INFORMATION - Annual Meeting 2020



Calvary's Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday, January 31 at 9:30 a.m. in the Sanctuary. <u>(Note: There will NOT be Christian</u> <u>Education or a 10:15 a.m. service that day.)</u>

Several important items will be voted on at that meeting specifically a ratification of amendments to the NALC Constitution. More information is provided below, along with a link to the specific

documents to support the amendments.

An Informational Meeting will be held THIS SUNDAY, January 24 at 9:15 a.m. in the Sanctuary. To be discussed at that informational session will be:

- 2020 Financial Results
- 2021 Budget
- Properties update
- NALC Ratification of Constitutional Amendments (see information below)

Copies of the Annual Report for 2020 can be picked up in the Narthex or viewed via this <u>LINK</u>. A separate Committee Report that summarizes activities for 2020 has also been compiled and can be viewed via this <u>LINK</u>.

Calvary Lutheran Church needs to ratify NALC Constitutional Amendments approved at the 2020 Mission Convocation. A copy of the information regarding these amendments can be read <u>HERE</u>.

There are two general amendments impacting various sections of the NALC Constitution. These amendments DO NOT impact the Constitution or Bylaws of Calvary Lutheran Church. Approval by the Calvary congregation can be as one or two resolutions.

- Determining the Lay Delegates at the Convocation currently this is a mathematical calculation based on the congregation's size. This has been challenging since the NALC congregations have a very different mix of sizes. The change would allow the Executive Council to determine the number based on current congregational and clergy membership.
- Change from an Annual Convocation to a Biennial Convocation. The main purpose of the amendments associated with this change is to address how the NALC, at all levels, deploys its resources to perform the mission of the Holy Spirit.

Nominating Committee Members Needed

Under our By-Laws, we need four members of the congregation for the 2021 Nominating Committee whose role is to identify three incoming Council members for 2022. If you are willing to serve on the Nominating Committee, you can reach out to Brad Meyer (Council President) or the church office. The tasks of this committee do not necessarily require in-person meetings and does not require a large time commitment.

Lynnae's Internship Concludes on January 31, 2021

Lynnae's internship program was accelerated due to the birth of her fourth child. She has completed all requirements.



Pastoral Intern Lynnae Douglas will be finishing her internship on January 31, 2021. We have truly enjoyed having her as an intern in our congregation for the past year. Hopefully she will get some well-deserved rest before the baby arrives in mid-February.

Lynnae will be writing the *"Pondering"* for next week's *Connections* so you will hear some final thoughts from her in that issue.




Monday Morning Movie

Quilts are created to be sent for the NALC


Disaster Relief programs and helping hands are always welcome!

Did you know we have a food pantry collection box in the back hallway near Nicole's office? Food items (*especially the "Big 8" items*) are always needed and can be placed into the pantry box at any time.

These items are used for individuals who stop by the church looking for food assistance. Surplus items are donated to the Waukesha Food Pantry for their distribution to the community.

Please check expiration dates on items being donated to make sure they are not past date.



The "Big 8" items most needed are:

- Canned fruits (esp. pineapple and mandarin oranges)
- Shelf stable protein (stews, tuna, chicken, spam, tofu)
- Rice brown, white and boxed mixes
- Chunky soup (ready-to-eat)
- Canned pasta with meat
- Shelf stable almond or soy milk
- Soaps, laundry detergent, toilet paper

A few reminders



The right side of the Sanctuary (as you face the altar) is equipped with a hearing loop system which transmits an audio signal directly into a hearing aid via a magnetic field. This greatly

reduces background noise, competing sounds, reverberation and other acoustic distortions that reduce clarity of sound.

Most hearing aids are equipped with a t-coil and connecting to this system is an easy switch on the hearing aid. If you need assistance during worship with this system, please reach out to an usher or any staff member.

Flowers are \$35 and may be taken home following the 10:15 a.m. worship on


The church office is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until noon. The door that is closest to the office (NW
