This Week's Pondering ...

Pastor Ken Nelson



"Now brothers, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did your leaders." Acts 3:17 "Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures." Luke 24:45

The book of Acts was written by Luke – who is reported to have been a physician. He was not an Apostle of the Lord (one of the twelve) but he was an evangelist of the church, and a studious one at that. We read in Luke 1:3-4 that Luke heard about Jesus and then "carefully investigated everything from the beginning" so that he could compose "an orderly account" and that we may "know for certain the things that have been taught"

about Jesus. Would a scientist do things any other way? It is not surprising that Luke should include phrases like "acted in ignorance" and "opened their minds so they could understand" in his writings.

I cannot stress enough the importance for Christians, as evangelists of Christ, to "open up our minds" to understand the Scriptures. Try this little exercise – jot down on a piece of paper or simply ask yourself if you could summarize the Bible's main message for someone who didn't know the Bible at all and was riding in an elevator with you. How would you explain it? What might your "elevator speech" contain if you had one minute to tell someone about the faith that lives in you?

In a recent workshop on evangelism called "Sharing Your Faith in a Digital Age" the presenters stressed importance of speaking in "sound bites" to an age of people for whom short, digital messages are the only thing they may hear. Our Evangelism Board heard sobering and compelling statistics of the number of current (and active) church members who did not feel they could convey the Bible's message well enough to start or sustain a conversation about Jesus to an unbeliever. Effective witnessing always begins with listening. The saying is sure - "listen first" to how someone describes the god they believe in (or don't believe in) before you tell them about your God and Savior Jesus.

If, in listening to someone talk about their beliefs, would you feel capable of sharing your understanding of God with them if you were to discover that the person -

was truly "in ignorance"?

had a complete misconception of God?

did not know how a person might enter a relationship with God?

didn't know they could be assured of eternal life in Christ?

Could you say to them, "If I thought your beliefs about forgiveness or salvation were wrong, would you want to know?" If so, then you are a step closer to being the one who could guide them to a clearer understanding - "opening their minds to understand the Scriptures".

Witnessing begins with the Holy Spirit calling someone through the gospel – but his witnesses need to know what the gospel is. That is the mission of the church. Our lesson from Acts makes it clear that it is hugely important to tell the message of Christ correctly and to know our audience so we can tell it contextually. In our continuing series on the Book of Acts and the Church, we see Peter in Acts 3 telling the plain truth. That is the "gospel", and we'll focus on what it means in our second of the series this weekend.

There are lots of things we can say about the gospel – but nothing more vital than that it is "the power of God for salvation to all who believe".

Sanctuary Flowers Sign Up

We invite you to sign up for flowers to beautify our altar each weekend. The sign-up sheet for this year is posted on the bulletin board in the Narthex.



Flowers are \$35 and you may take them home following the 10:15 am worship on Sunday morning. If you'd prefer, you can leave the flowers at church to be enjoyed by the office staff.



The right side of the Sanctuary (as you face the altar) is equipped with a hearing loop system which transmits an audio signal directly into a hearing aid via a magnetic field. This greatly

reduces background noise, competing sounds, reverberation and other acoustic distortions that reduce clarity of sound.

Most hearing aids are equipped with a t-coil and connecting to this system is an easy switch on the hearing aid. If you need assistance during worship with this system, please reach out to an usher or any staff member.

The church office is open Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. until noon. The door that is closest to the office (NW



corner) will be open during those hours.

Please check in with the office staff so we know you are in the building.

If you are choosing to remain at home during the COVID-19 pandemic, any Calvary member, regardless of age or health, can request consecrated bread and juice from the weekend worship service. A sealed communion "kit", along with simple instructions to prepare you for communion, can be dropped off at your home by a member of our home communion ministry team.
